The following list is in no particular order. If you need help using Slack, here's their "getting started" page.

Use Threads: If you're responding to a specific message, use threads to keep the conversation organized and avoid cluttering the main channel.

Be Respectful: Always treat others with kindness and respect. Keep discussions professional and constructive. Avoid making personal attacks or offensive remarks.

Use Emojis and Reactions: Emojis and reactions can be a fun way to express yourself, but make sure to use them in a respectful manner.

Stay on Topic: Each channel has a purpose. Make sure your messages are relevant to the topic of the channel you're posting in.

Listen and Learn: Be open to other viewpoints and always seek to learn from the discussions. Don't be afraid to ask questions if you don't understand something.

Keep it Brief: Slack is meant for quick, casual, convos. It's not an email.

Avoid Spam: Don't post the same message in multiple channels. Avoid excessive self-promotion or off-topic discussions.

Share Stuff: Share resources and information that are helpful and relevant to the community.

Acknowledge and Give Credit: When someone helps you or provides useful information, acknowledge them. Giving credit where it's due fosters a healthy, collaborative environment.

Ask for Help: When asking for help, provide as much context as possible and ask your question in a respectful and considerate manner.

Use Direct Messages for Personal Conversations: If you need to have a one-on-one conversation with someone that might be better kept private, slide into their DMs.
