Information about Required Vaccines

Summer is coming! Be sure to get your vaccines scheduled so they are completed before school starts. Please note what is needed for incoming 6th graders.

 Colorado law requires students who attend a public, private, or parochial kindergarten - 12th grade school to be vaccinated against many diseases vaccines can prevent, unless a certificate of exemption is filed. For more information, visit the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment required vaccines web page.

Your student must be vaccinated against:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap)
- Hepatitis B (HepB)
- Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR)
- o Polio (IPV)
- Varicella (chickenpox)
- Colorado follows recommendations set by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
 - Students entering kindergarten must receive their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and varicella.
 - Students entering 6th grade must receive one dose of Tdap vaccine, even if they are under 11 years of age.
 - All recommendations are on the <u>Centers for Disease Control vaccine schedule web</u> <u>page.</u>
- Vaccines are recommended for hepatitis A, influenza, meningococcal disease and human papillomavirus, but are not required.
