Much of the content published on the website comes from various online sources, with the exception of Paul Brunton's texts, which come exclusively from the Paul Brunton Philosophical Foundation (PBPF) and Paul Brunton's Daily Note. Most of the texts by other authors accompanying PB's writings were already in English and were simply translated into Spanish for the WEB-UR version in that language.

Accuracy of the translations

The texts to be translated into English underwent a **meticulous review** in order to first decipher and then accurately convey the underlying meaning that the authors intended in their messages; this has been our guiding principle in our efforts to provide the most faithful and accurate version of each one.
