

AKA Scholarship

Deadline: November 24, 2025 at 11:59pm

Eligibility Requirements

- All applicants must be permanent residents of Howard County.
- Current high school senior
- Seeking to begin their undergraduate studies in the fall of 2026
- Minimum GPA requirement is 2.50 on a 4.0 GPA scale.
- The applicant must demonstrate strong leadership skills and commitment to scholastic endeavors.

Scholarship award: \$1,000

Ronald W. Reagan Leadership Program (RLP)

Deadline: Oct 31, 2025



Eureka College is a small liberal arts college in central Illinois.

Each year, Eureka College offers multiple four-year full-tuition scholarships to students through the RLP. The RLP, in addition to the full-tuition scholarship, offers students international travel experiences, fully funded internship and mentorship experiences, leadership training, and professional networking. I have attached a flyer with more information.

- Students who have earned a cumulative 3.30 weighted or unweighted GPA at the time of application are eligible.
- We are seeking applicants who are preparing to graduate in spring 2026 and to enroll in college for the fall 2026 semester.

Interested students can apply by completing the following steps:

- Reviewing our website at <u>rlp.eureka.edu</u>.
- <u>Submitting their application to Eureka College</u>. The application is free and can be completed quickly. Students should submit unofficial transcripts showing grades through the end of junior year. Submission of this application will automatically begin the application process for the Reagan Leadership Program.

Once a student's application has been received and transcripts have been reviewed, the RLP Director will reach out to the student with a link to RSVP for one of our two scholarship competitions this fall.

We will host an on-campus scholarship competition on **Saturday, November 8** as well as a virtual scholarship competition via Zoom on **Saturday, November 15**. Students from Maryland would be eligible to compete in the virtual scholarship competition or, if preferred, to join us on campus.

Both competitions include interviews, opportunities to meet with current program faculty and students, and a group leadership exercise. The competition, in conjunction with a brief leadership reflection submitted in advance of the competition (but after the application and RSVP), will be used to select finalists for the scholarship. Finalists will be invited to complete virtual interviews with the selection committee in early December.

Tiffani Monique Johnson Art Scholarship

Deadline: December 31, 2025

Applications are now open for the Tiffani Monique Johnson Art Scholarship, created in memory of Tiffani Monique Johnson, a talented artist, mentor, and advocate for creativity and self-expression. This scholarship celebrates her legacy by supporting young artists who demonstrate exceptional talent, creativity, and dedication in the visual arts.

This year, three scholarships valued at \$1,000 each will be awarded to deserving high school seniors or current college students pursuing studies in the visual arts. Students must apply to be considered.

• Awards: Three scholarships at \$1,000 each

- Eligibility: High school seniors or current college students pursuing visual arts (painting, sculpture, photography, graphic design, nails, etc.)
 - GPA Requirement: Minimum 3.0
 - Portfolio: At least five original art pieces
- Personal Statement: 500–1,000 words about artistic journey, inspiration, and aspirations
 - Recommendations: Two letters from art teachers, mentors, or professionals
 - Deadline: December 31, 2025

The Howard County Arts Council is pleased to offer scholarships for students who would like to pursue a degree in the arts. This year, HoCo Arts will award scholarship funds to students entering college in the 2026-2027 academic year. Scholarships must be used for enrollment in an accredited college program for a degree in the arts. Awards may be used for tuition and fees only. Applications will be reviewed by the Arts Council's Scholarship Panel. Review criteria will include artistic merit, demonstrated knowledge of an artistic discipline, commitment to a career in the arts, and a demonstrated track record of success in an academic setting. Applicants will be notified of their application status in March 2026.

American Legion - National Oratorical Contest

The American Legion's 2026 Oratorical Contest Scholarship Program beginning in September and concluding in May will hold post-level contests in early 2026. The contest for Legion Posts 156 in Ellicott City and post 300 in Columbia will be held on January 10, 2026 from 12:30pm to 3:00pm at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post in Ellicott City. Dates and times TBA.

Contest winners will receive a scholarship award at each post, district, and state level:

1st Place: \$25,000 2nd Place: \$22,500 3rd Place: \$20,000

A student who qualifies in the National Oratorical Contest first round receives a scholarship of \$2,000. A contestant who advances past the first round will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship.
