

## FRAMEWORK FOR THE HOLISTIC ASSESSMENT OF TEACHING

Standard Teaching Assessment Rubric (STAR)

**Directions:** Rate each benchmark as "Developing (1)", "Effective (2)", or "Expert (3)." For each benchmark, consult at least two sources of evidence and document them in the rubric. Reflective narratives, course materials, and student feedback must be consulted at least once. Evidence of learning and peer review may be required by some departments for some groups of faculty (e.g., pre-tenure), but must be specified in departmental procedures. If an instructor has made at least two significant contributions beyond the classroom, it should be noted with a checkmark and documented in the notes. The overall score will calculate automatically, but the Chair can override with an explanation.
