## Presenting and Revising and Submitting Your Work

#### The assignments:

- Help you experience learning in new and different ways (e.g., experiencing games, discussing games, doing analysis projects, participating, reflecting)

### Steps for presenting and submitting work

#### Before

- 1. Look over your work (on paper / a digital document)
- 2. Highlight your main ideas.

#### During

- 3. Share your work and focus on the main ideas.
  - a. Options: Hang up papers / Present google document / round robin mixer / ...
- 4. Audience: take notes, listen carefully

#### After:

- 5. **Audience**: give comments: write a question/comment on a post it (and sign your name) and stick it to the work / give it to the speaker.
- 6. Presenter: Think about the comments. Make a short presentation about how you will answer the questions and comments.

#### Then:

- 7. Before handing in your work (you may take another week or two to complete your work):
  - a. Revise your work. Improve your ideas. Polish your product.
  - b. Consider the audience's comments (#5) carefully. Include your responses (in #6) in your revised work.
  - c. Interrogate your own work. Ask yourself "Why?" "How?" "What?" to deepen your ideas and work.
  - d. Complete a reflective diary.

#### Finally:

- 8. Hand in your work:
  - a. Your revised project work
  - b. Your reflective diary
