Sample Email

At a Vets Town Hall, veterans are invited to speak for up to ten minutes each about their experiences serving in the military, and how those experiences have affected them. Non-veterans are encouraged to attend and listen. The goal is to increase understanding between veterans and non-veterans in our community. These events are free and nonpolitical, and all perspectives are valued.

This November, there will be seven Vets Town Halls in Vermont (in Bennington, Brattleboro, Charlotte, Colchester, Montpelier, Rutland, and Saint Johnsbury). TOWN NAME is the closest to us, on DATE at TIME at VENUE.

With Veterans Day approaching, these events are a way to literally show up for our friends, family members, neighbors, and colleagues who are veterans.
