Gradeit.io - Great quizzes for technical aspects of diagrams - easy to do in 20 minute blocks also gives good feedback when you get an answer incorrect Past Papers - Links to every past paper, mark scheme, and examiner report. Make sure you choose the A-Level Papers and not the AS ones! Practise writing a couple of answers first then check the mark scheme. Focus on accuracy first, then introduce time limits to make sure you can answer them under timed exam type pressure. Quizlet Flashcards - Some fantastic sets of quizlet key terms from econosaurus - Brilliant for short blocks of revision - on the train/waiting for the bus etc. Flash cards made by an excellent economics teacher and free for you to use. Econplusdal - Youtube - Great videos on nearly every topic - watch, pause, copy the diagrams, then try to explain them out loud afterwards Physics and Maths Tutor - Good detailed notes and summary notes for each topic of the course - avoid just copying out notes - read them then try to summarise them from memory a few minutes later.



			Use your Personal Learning Checklist (your individual one has been shared via google classroom). This breaks down the whole specification into a spreadsheet. You can use it to: a)RAG your understanding of a Theme which will then help you prioritise which sections to focus on revising first. b)You can also use it to link any articles you have read to different areas of the specification. Do it by copying the link to the article and then pasting it next to as many areas of the course as possible. Economics is a synoptic subject, meaning that everything you learn links together. By doing this exercise you will see the links between the curriculum and build some great application examples to use in your 25 mark questions.
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
