**WHEREAS**, on May 22, 2023, the Board received and publicly opened seven bids for the Project as set forth in the attached Bid Tabulation prepared by FKA Architects; and

WHEREAS, Belmont Construction submitted a bid that complied in all material respects, and is the lowest responsible bid when factoring in the base bid of \$6,552,000, Alternate No. 1 (Classroom Clerestory Roofs) adding \$360,000, Alternate No. 1A (Standing Seam Metal Roof) adding \$165,000, and Alternate 4 (Window Roller Shades) adding \$10,000, for a total of \$7,087,000;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board hereby awards the contract for the Project to Belmont Construction in the amounts set forth above; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this award is further conditioned upon the contractor furnishing the requisite insurance certificate and labor and materials/performance bond as required in the project specifications, together with an AA201-Project Manning Report, and an executed A-101, Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor, and an A-201, General Conditions of the Contract for Construction, as prepared by the Board Attorney and/or Environmental Consultant, within ten days of the date hereof; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board Attorney and/or Environmental Consultant are hereby directed to draft the agreements with the successful bidder consistent with this Resolution and with the terms contained in the bid documents

approved by the Board for the Projects. The Board President and the Board Secretary are hereby authorized to execute such agreement and any other documents necessary to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.
