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You will be asked to provide a video to show a 360	
degree clear view of all areas of your garden	
including side returns, gates, gaps down the side of	
sheds or summer houses, patio doors etc. Guidance	
will be given by kennel hands for videos.

Have you ever homed a greyhound from the Greyhound Trust before, or any other greyhound specific organisation/charity?	
Have you, or anyone in your household, ever been banned from keeping any animal?	
Have you ever been rejected by an animal charity as a home/foster for a dog? If so, why?	

Have you ever had to return a dog to Greyhound Trust, Other Rehoming Centre or Breeder? What were the	
circumstances surrounding the return?	
Please be honest.	
This will not exclude you from homing a dog from us but will help us find the right dog for your circumstances.	
What previous experience do you have with dogs (other than any existing pet) and, specifically, greyhounds? If no experience with dogs or greyhounds have you researched the breed?	
Please tell us about any previous/current pets and if you had any problems with pets before? How did they resolve them?	
What arrangements would you put into place for your dog(s) – ie sleeping arrangements – where and on what?	
Where will they be fed? Recommend raised feed stand.	
What areas of the house the dog(s) will/won't have access to?	
Have you got an area in your home which can be used as a safe space for your dog, if needed?	
Some greyhounds do not like thunder and fireworks and like a safe space to hide.	
How much exercise will the dog(s) get and where?	
(Recommend 2 x 20 mins twice a day and build up tolerance and stamina for longer walks. Advise against off lead exercise unless in secure fully fenced area depending on any previous race injuries)	
Will the dog live indoors as part of the family?	//N
Where will the dog(s) go when you are out of the house?	
What transport do you have access to, and would you be able to utilise it for a dog – i.e vet / branch visits for nail clipping / socialisation visits/ days out?	
Do you have a suitable method to safely transport a dog, i.e. dog guard?	
It can invalidate your car insurance if your dog is not safely transported. Behind a dog guard is best as greyhounds are too leggy to comfortable be attached by harness on back seats.
