It should outline the sample size and characteristics, sampling techniques, data collection instruments, and research procedures. In addition, the methods of data analysis and presentation should be clearly specified, along with a discussion of issues related to the validity and reliability of the research instruments. **Results:** The results section presents the principal findings of the study in a clear, concise, and informative manner, aligned with the research objectives and without excessive interpretation. **Unique Contribution:** This section articulates the distinctive contribution of the manuscript to existing knowledge by highlighting its theoretical, practical, or methodological significance and emphasizing the novelty offered by the study. **Conclusion:** The conclusion succinctly synthesizes the overall research process and key findings, while highlighting the primary implications of the results. **Recommendations:** This section outlines relevant recommendations for future research on the topic or for the broader application of the study's findings. The required abstract length should be between 250 and 300 words. The abstract must be written in clear and accurate language, with no spelling, grammatical, or expression errors.

INTRODUCTION

The introduction explains the purpose of the study and the reasons for conducting it. The main body of an article should begin with an introductory section that provides more detail on the paper's purpose, motivation, research methods, and findings. The introduction should be relatively nontechnical, yet clear enough for an informed reader to understand the manuscript's contribution. Generally, the *Journal of Economics, Law, and Humanities* publishes articles in either English or Indonesian. The article also consists of 1 column, using the "Palatino Linotype" font in size 11 and 1.5 line spacing. This template is designed to assist the author in preparing a manuscript; it is an exact representation of the format the editor expects.

At the end of the introduction section, the authors should state the objectives of the work. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background and a brief literature survey to record the existing solutions/methods, to show which is the best of previous research, to show the main limitation of the previous research, to show what the achievement is (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper. Avoid a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

METHOD

It should be written in paragraphs. It explains the research approach, the types of research, the data collection technique, and the data analysis. They should reflect on and appropriately describe the study's purpose. In the next paragraph, the author must display the research framework in a concept map or diagram.

FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

Findings

Finding information on several important data (original) fields obtained from questionnaires, surveys, documents, interviews, observations, and other data collection techniques. It can be completed with a table or graphic to clarify the result. All figures and tables should be centered and numbered consecutively. Tables (refer to Table 1, Table 2, and Table 3...) should be presented above the table and contained in center alignment. A descriptive title should be placed after the table title (refer to Table 1, Table 2, and Table 3...) above each table. The source table should be placed below it, aligned to the right. Figures (refer to Figure 1, Figure 2, and Figure 3...)

should be presented below each figure and followed by the description of the figure.

Discussion

Discussion is the most important part of writing a journal article. At this stage, the author must present the thesis and research findings systematically, scientifically, and factually. Explain the impact of research findings. The writer must then compare the results with previous studies relevant to the topic of discussion.

CONCLUSION

Conclusions should address the research objectives. Explain how your work advances the field from the current state of knowledge. Without clear Conclusions: Reviewers and readers will find it difficult to judge the work and determine whether it merits publication in the journal. Do not repeat the abstract or just list experimental results. Provide a clear scientific justification for your work, and indicate possible applications and extensions. You should also suggest future experiments and point out those that are underway.

REFERENCES

References should be cited both in the text and in the reference list, and they should conform to the American Psychological Association (7th ed.) or <https://apastyle.apa.org/blog>. It should be listed in alphabetical order. Please cite all information from other sources in your manuscript. A minimum of 80% of sources published within the last 10 years is required for each submission. Articles in the Journal of Economics, Law, and Humanities are recommended as references. Please note that your references must follow the American Psychological Association (APA) 7th Edition style (the editor will return your submission for your correction if you do not properly format your references).
