## **Curriculum updates**

Math-

**Ms. Ericson:** We wrapped up chapter 7, and are now skipping ahead to do some geometry in chapter 15. They will be learning how to classify triangles and quadrilaterals. After Thanksgiving break we are going to do an exciting project to enhance what they have learned that will help reinforce decimals and geometry and measuring!!

**Ms.** Hein: After the Thanksgiving break, we will break into the world of fractions. We will first start with adding and subtracting with unlike denominators and then move to multiplying and dividing. Below is the link to the parent letter with more information:

**Mr. Anderson**: This month we will be in the thick of math testing, but in the times when we are not testing we will be working on Chapter 9: Adding and Subtracting Fractions with Unlike Denominators. This chapter will focus on adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators, finding common denominators, and multiplying fractions. Please continue to work on these skills at home. I also wanted to take a moment to give props to our class, they have been absolute rockstars with geometry and volume!

Ms. Bambury & Ms. Mitchell: For the past week and a half we have been working on Chapter 15 (Identifying and Classifying Two-Dimensional and Three-Dimensional Figures). After Thanksgiving break we will begin Chapter 16, which is all about Volume. Once we finish these two geometry chapters, we will embark on the long journey through the land of fractions. PLEASE continue to practice mixed multiplication facts with your child so they can be fluent and fast. Also, every student in our class is required to complete one i-Ready lesson each week, and it will be counted as a homework grade.

**Literacy**- We started Unit 2 of CKLA Ancient Civilizations. Below is the parent letter with an overview of what students will be learning.

History- We will be wrapping up our unit about "The Reformation" by designing our own cities, coming up with rules for our cities, and convincing the rest of the class why our city is the best one to live in. So far we have learned about Martin Luther and his "crazy accusations," Ulrich Zwingli and his "fight" with Luther, King Henry VIII, and John Calvin and his rules for Geneva. We will finish out our content for this unit with Reformation Scientists: Copernicus and Galileo. At the end of this unit we will have a group project; this will be a large grade and it will be important that we follow the directions that will be in Google Classroom in order to be successful with this assignment. Once we finish up this unit we will move into learning about "The Golden Age of England."

Science- We wrapped up our Space Systems unit at the end of the trimester and are now into our Matter unit, which coincides with STEM. Half the students will be with me and the other half will be with Melissa Jones for STEM, see below for information on what they will be doing! Half way through the trimester we will switch and the kids who were with her will come to me and my kids will go to her. This is great because we can really dive into the curriculum with the smaller class sizes! You should look forward to some fun conversations that they will have about the experiments we are doing!

#### **STEM**

Trimester 2, which starts on November 18th, means that it's time for STEM! 5th grade will be divided into 2 groups and each group will have a ½ trimester of STEM and ½ trimester of Science. The format is the same as it was last year. This year in STEM the students will be exploring a new robot. The LEGO Education group updated the EV3 that we have used for the last 10 years to a robot called Spike Prime. We named him the Rebel Bot. We will explore movement and sensors with this robot during our robotics unit. The students continue to code with scratch and will deepen their understanding of operators, functions and conditional statements in their coding. We will use some fun challenges to make this learning exciting and engaging. The dates for the first group will be November 18th-January 14th. The second group will be from January 15-February 21.
