From the Pathbrite interview: What do you think is really needed to prepare students for the workplace? What are employers looking for? It sounds like you don't think students are receiving the necessary education.


No. If we make our bad schools incrementally better for our poor kids by testing them more frequently and holding teachers more accountable, some people think that everything's going to be well. But there's absolutely zero evidence for that. [Students need] three things: they need content knowledge, but that's the easy part today. It's online; you don't need a teacher to acquire content. The world simply doesn't care how much you know anymore because Google knows everything. **What the world** 

### cares about, now that content has become a commodity, is what you can do with what you

**know.** And that suggests the two other education outcomes that are absolutely critical, and to simplify them I call them **skill and will**. Students need a new set of skills to thrive for work learning and citizenship in the 21st century; and they need will, meaning motivation, and arguably the most important is motivation. Because if you are motivated you will continuously learn new skills and new content knowledge, which you will have to in this era, and it's the thing we do the most damage to in our schools today.



## How NOT to do portfolios



There are schools that use portfolios in Florida. There's a video on YouTube that aims to train students in how to use iPortfolio. I fell asleep after two minutes.

### 1. Don't use a standard format

Tom Peters (author of dozens of books about how to create innovative businesses) wrote, "One-size-fits-all actually fits only one." ...the person who created the system.

# 2. Don't put a standard like "one artifact per course per semester."

### iPortfolio Requirements

Students are expected to add 1 artifact per course per semester.

# 3. Don't use the word "artifact." Use concrete words.

Book review, essay, video, blog post, poster, slideshow, powerpoint presentation... it's okay to be specific. We are speaking to students who might not know what an artifact is.

### Here's how a school in New Jersey describes portfolios to its students:



High Tech High School highly recommends a portfolio for the admissions process. A portfolio should showcase the student's strengths, interests, and hobbies. It should show how well-rounded a student is and how the student is someone beyond academic grades.

#### Sample things to include in a portfolio:

- Accomplishments, such as CIRCLE awards or certificates of participation in special programs. If you don't have the actual awards or if you have too many, you can make a list of the awards and include a copy of one award.
- Participation in sports activities.
- Participation in arts activities (e.g. pictures of modeling or theater productions).
- Participation in after-school activities.
- Exemplary academic work done at LCCS.
- Participation in volunteer activities.
- Products of work (e.g. artwork, sketches, writing samples, poetry, etc.).



The guiding pedagogy at the School is project-based learning, an approach which transforms teaching from "teachers telling" to "students doing." More specifically, project-based learning can be defined as:

- Engaging learning experiences that involve students in complex, real-world projects through which they develop and apply skills and knowledge
- A strategy that recognizes that significant learning taps students' inherent drive to learn, capability to do work, and need to be taken seriously
- Learning in which curricular outcomes can be identified up front, but in which the outcomes of the student's learning process are neither predetermined nor fully predictable
- Learning that requires students to draw from many information sources and disciplines in order to solve problems
- Experiences through which students learn to manage and allocate resources such as time and materials<sup>1</sup>

The School's project-based learning approach is the key to its success in serving a diverse population of students. The School's students become active participants in their learning and are required to publicly demonstrate their learning through presentations and portfolios, introducing an additional, and arguably more authentic, element of accountability for quality work. The School works diligently to provide exemplars of outstanding project-based instruction to its teachers so that all teachers may achieve base mastery in HTH teaching

Within the first week we had to start our digital portfolio, and I got introduced to the subject of web design. I read a book to learn to do HTML, and I started reading book after book about website design. A year and a half later I was already doing work for this company, and now I go to seminars on web design. I met a guy in multimedia at San Diego State University, and we kept in constant contact, talking about what I could do. He is now my mentor on my internship. — **Jose, HTH student** 

It's different working with another person. You might have one idea of how you want it to turn out, but they have a different brain and they might have another idea. Part of the reason they have us do group work, I think, is so that we can learn to work with people we probably wouldn't otherwise want to work with. In college and in your career you might need that. — Max, HTH student

ith the lively but purposeful tone of a high-tech workplace, San Diego's High Tech High (HTH) aims to know its students well, forge strong connections between their academic work and the outside world, and hold the entire enterprise to a common intellectual mission.



### **Habits of Mind**

One of the cornerstones of project based learning is for students to develop strong "Habits of Mind"



The Muscatine Community School District is largely basing its PBL practices on the High Tech High model. The most common set of HTH Habits of Mind are: Significance, Perspective, Evidence, Connection and Supposition. This set of habits conveniently forms the somewhat descriptive acronym, "SPECS." Upon considering this set of mental habits, I noticed that inquiry was not among them so we added that and modified the acronym to "iSPECS." After all, asking one's own questions is about as personal as it gets.

"Just having portfolios" does not make a school better. Other elements, like real-world projects and off-site internships, help to build the content of the portfolios.

#### Design Principles

The School is guided by three design principles:

#### Personalization

The School personalizes learning by providing an advisor for students and encouraging students to pursue personal interests through projects. Students create a personal digital portfolio of work samples and reflections on learning.

#### Adult World Connection

Students engage in real world projects that enable them to learn while working on problems of interest and concern to the larger community. Students in 11<sup>th</sup> grade engage in off-site academic internships at area companies, nonprofits and public agencies. Younger students prepare for internships by participating in worksite visits and "power lunches" at the School, where adults from the community discuss their work lives and choices.

#### Common Intellectual Mission

Centered on the five High Tech High *Habits of Mind* (perspective, evidence, relevance, connection, and supposition), our curriculum is engaging and rigorous. The School avoids "tracking" and other forms of ability grouping, and our curriculum ensures that all students who graduate from the School meet the University of California A-G requirements.

# Schools that hope to bring the value of digital portfolios to their students will want to copy some of the procedures used at High Tech High.

Procedures for helping students who might struggle with setting up and maintaining portfolios.

#### Plan for Students Who Are Low Achieving

The School has developed a number of strategies to address the needs of students with a wide range of prior experience and achievement.

- The School provides support to students both in and out of the core courses. This may take the form of after school tutoring or tutoring during lunch or elective time. The School also has an active peer tutoring program.
- Because of the project-based curriculum and small class size, teachers are able to spend time with students needing extra support on both projects and basic skills.
- Project-based learning lends itself nicely to building basic skills because students come to understand how math, humanities and science skills are necessary to address realworld problems.
- Reading and Writing workshops allow for building content knowledge while reading levels are improved through books at varied levels of difficulty.
- The School offers summer school programs for current students needing additional support in the core areas of math and English.

### Differentiation of teaching methods

### Plan for Students Who Are High Achieving

The School does not track students. Rather, within each class, the School's teachers challenge and support each student to aim for their personal best, employing a variety of strategies for inspiring and recognizing high achievement:

- Alternative "challenge" assignments for reading, writing, problem solving, and inquiry
  are routinely offered to students to give them the opportunity to gain a deeper
  understanding of course content. Any student may choose to pursue any, all, or none of
  these "challenge" assignments during the course of the term.
- Students may elect at the beginning of the term to pursue an honors option in any core
  academic course by preparing a separate portfolio of cumulative "honors work" in
  addition to the regular course work. Requirements and performance standards for the
  honors option are set and announced by the course instructor.
- Juniors and seniors who successfully pursue the honors option in a course have that course designated as an honors course and weighted accordingly on their transcript.



### What if a student doesn't have a lot of book reviews, essays and projects?

essays and collections that are important to me." The college admissions counselor and anyone who might want to employ the student can learn something about the student's interests. "What will this person bring to our organization?" is the question in the minds of people who look at resumes, CVs and portfolios. The Portfolio can present more than just the academic work of the student. A student's playlist can say something about "what's important to

me."

### What if there are objectionable videos on the student's YouTube account?

Answer: Make the item "private."



### What if there are questionable photos on the student's Instagram and Facebook accounts?

Answer: Suggest to the student that the photos can be removed or stored elsewhere or made private.

### What categories can be included in a Digital Portfolio?

Answer: A blog allows the student to reflect on learning and the journey toward adulthood.

Photos and videos from social media allow the student's personality to be shown and heard.

A photo gallery allows visitors to see a summary of what's in the blog. "Contact me" gives the preferred method of contact and invites comments from other students.

### What should NOT be in a digital portfolio?

Answer: The student's home address should probably not be included. If students are worried about the security of their email addresses, perhaps students can create an address that is dedicated to school work.

### How much does it cost to set up and maintain a digital portfolio?

Answer: A skeleton or frame of a portfolio can usually be put together in under 45 minutes. The set up could take two hours per student. I have found that students sometimes want to create materials and additional categories during the setup period. That desire to add items can extend the setup time, but it is often delightful to see the creativity of the students emerge.

When administrators ask this question, I think to myself, *What does it* cost you to *NOT create and maintain a DP?* Pearson charged \$25 per account (in June 2016).


#### 2. What is the real cost of implementing across the school?



**HOW** do we store the Digital Portfolio? **How to Set Up the Web Site** 

Ben Staley

Here's what Ben Staley wrote (when asked for his system and secret to making a template):

The Adobe Master Collection is a series of programs used to manipulate photos and videos. I edited pictures and made others and implemented them into my DP. In the edit section of Google sites for any of the standard templates, you can replace images and settings. I recommend your students research using something like YouTube. The basic idea is find something you want to replace. Use something like Photoshop or Illustrator (programs included in the Adobe Master Collection) to manipulate, create or enhance an image. Then find that section of the page in the template settings and replace or add the image you created. As a general rule of thumb for any graphic creations, I recommend a limited color palette. To much color can distract from information and gives the onlooker a sense of messiness. I learned most of what I know about Google sites from online tutorials, so that's what I recommend you do.





### **Responses from Abel:**

Yeah, you can use my Dp and I'm fine with your students asking me questions.

1. Is there a reason why you chose to use weebly and you did not use Google Sites?

Well, the funny thing is that I actually used to use Google Sites. Using Digital Portfolios in the High Tech village is something everyone has experience with. The first DP that I ever made was in Middle School and it was Google Sites. For years I used google sites up until High School I've found that using weebly was easier, it looked better and allowed you to be more creative than using google sites.

2. How much training did the school give you? Or did you already know how to make a website? (Does the school require every student to have a website to show their work)

Yes, everyone is required to have a digital portfolio. In 6th grade which is when I started using DPs, they gave us instructions on how to use DPs and how to set them up. From then on you learn from just trying to make your DP look better and more cooler then your friends. I never had any experience with weebly but once I started playing around with it, I got the hang of it.

3. How long did it take you to set up the first weebly website?

I probably would say that it didn't take me longer than a couple hours to complete it because it was easy to put everything in. But when I first made a weebly website, it wasn't quite as good as the way it is right now. It went through many drafts and many edits. Sometimes I had to reformat my whole entire website because I felt that it wasn't good enough or it wasn't professional or I thought of a better idea.

4. Is the weebly website free?

Yes, 100% free. I believe that the only time you have to pay is if you want to get rid of the .weeblu.com that appears with your free website that you created.

5. How many hours did you put in over the year?

I can't really estimate how many hours that I've done because that's hard to keep track of, but if I had to guess, maybe 5-10 hours.

6. I noticed that you have just a few categories. It is so much easier to read your portfolio compared to other students. I can see your internship and your projects. That's easy. How did you come up with such a simple format? (my teacher Mr. Steve has a really complicated format

The way that I thought of making my website was something that was simple, **easy to look at and easy to navigate**. I made sure everything followed that. I also didn't want to cram every single page with loads of information. That's why for my projects page you can see a description of a project and, if you want to know more, you simply click on the pictures.





## **Biodiversity Project**

During this project, we grabbed ARMS ( Autonomous Reef Monitoring System) units that were located in the San Diego Bay, and La Jolla cove. We went out as a team and retrieved the ARMS. They were many different types of jobs during this such as the swimmers, kayakers and photographers. Afterwards we used a program called CPCe. It helped us determine each creature that we were dealing with. We labeled them on the program and it helped us see the percentage of all of the different creatures. Then in small groups we developed a question that we could research and answer.





#### Reel Delicious

In this project we carried on a food truck form the year before from the previous sophomores. We fixed and updated the truck as well as put on a reverse pop up restaurant for diverse community members. We raised money throughout the year, broke down our recipes, and created movies along side for our big event at the pop up restaurant. Click the picture for more detail.

In this project we spent about three months learning instruments. We built instruments from recycled items, and had to make professional made instruments. #### My Internship at Catalyst Physical Therapy and Wellness



Since I was small I cared about health and being active which is why I'm so interested in a Physical Therapy internship. Being active and being able to move is a very important part of life and everyone should be able to move. Which is why I would want to devote my career into helping people with injuries and making them active and happy.

I interned at Catalyst Physical Therapy and wellness. Physical therapist here treat patients in whatever problems they have. If it's back, shoulder, leg or if their coming in just because of

an injury they can be assisted. When patients first come in they get a free injury screen, which is basically an initial evaluation of the patient. They write a SOAP note which stands for Subjective, Objective, Assessment and Plan. *Steve:* I would improve this resume page by posting the resume on the screen so that the viewer doesn't have to DOWNLOAD a document to see the contents of the resume.







Notice where Abel placed the download link for his résumé. Not at the top of each page. If you want to reach Abel, you need to read his description of the internship. By then, you as the reader will be transformed into thinking, "Hey, this kid has a future in healthcare." Clever procedure. His email is not displayed openly, so that "spiders" can't search the website to get his contact info. However, the motivated reader of the site will have a way to contact him.

# Let's look at a High Tech High Student Website Page by Page (3): The Blog

The Blog is a place for reflecting on "what it means to be a student who uses a digital portfolio and who participates in a school that uses projects."

Get into the minds of readers who have not attended your school. Ask yourself:

What is it like to do one large project, involving the input of two or three teachers, so that you can invest yourself into the work?

Instead of creating four separate projects, what is it like to create a project that gives credit in several classes and gets feedback from several teachers?

Here's a list of questions to ask when writing a blog.

**Backward:** What problems did you encounter while you were working on this piece? How did you solve them?

**Forward:** One thing I would like to improve upon is ...

**Inward:** What were your goals for meeting this piece of work? Did your goals change as you worked on it?

**Outward:** If you were the teacher, what comments would you make about this piece? Some of us are intimidated by a list of 40 questions.

#### The 40 Reflection Questions

#### Backward-Looking:

- How much did you know about the subject before we started?
- 2. What process did you go through to produce this piece?
- Have you done a similar kind of work in the past (earlier in the year or in a previous grade; in school or out of school)?
- 4. In what ways have you gotten better at this kind of work?
- 5. In what ways do you think you need to improve?
- 6. What problems did you encounter while you were working on this piece? How did you solve them?
- 7. What resources did you use while working on this piece? Which ones were especially helpful? Which ones would you use again?
- 8. Does this work tell a story?

# More tips from Abel Thon

1. Has the Digital Portfolio been useful for your college application process?

ABEL: We haven't used this for college application process because I work on that next year, but I don't see how it wouldn't help. A page with your best work is included and you describe your plans for the future. It only seems to help your chances of getting into a good college.

2. What tips do you have for students?

ANSWER: There are always traditional ways of doing things and then there's being creative. I would say **try and be as creative as you can when you want to create a digital portfolio because there's never one way to do things.** 

- 3. Some teachers and principals are worried about "online safety of the students." Did you ever get harassed or contacted by strangers because you put a website online with your email address?

  ABEL: I have never gotten harassed by a stranger because of my DP. But even if that were to happen, there are ways of preventing strangers from contacting you
- 4. One of the arguments that I hear from principals is that **'online exposure is too risky for schools'**. You can imagine the chain of events: *student puts up a website, a creepy stranger contacts the student, the creepy person sees the student in a photo on the student website and then appears at the school and stalks the student.... something terrible happens, the police capture the creepy person and the creepy person says, "I found the student online" and the school gets sued by the parents.*What response do you have to this argument against DPs? Has the DP process been overall positive for you?

ABEL: Of course, there always is a chance of that scenario happening, but I think the way to look at this is by looking at the cost and benefits. I feel that the benefits of having DP's outweigh the cost. Having DPs can help you get internships, help with college applications and perhaps help you get a job in the future. If we focus on the "what ifs" too much and not doing things because "something might happen," then you may be ruining a student's chances of getting benefits from DPs.

# The "unusual" parts of the XYD template

Scan through student websites that are displayed on High Tech High's site and you'll notice that the typical focus is on academics: *Projects (grouped by grade level or year), essays and blogs.* The XYD template goes farther. Here are some topics to give you ideas about how to *personalize your student website* (add an unusual or "eye-catching" category). # Talking Points for "Building Websites for Students"

# There are 4 key principles

- 1. Students control the content of their websites
- 2. The School chooses whether or not to link the student's site to the "List of Websites Made by Our Students" list that is hosted on the School website.



**HTH Digital Portfolios** 

- 3. Students are advised to put POSITIVE INFORMATION on their portfolio that shows work that the students created for school.
- 4. The students are encouraged to keep "their observations" on a separate blog. Experiments with comedy, humor and satire are placed on independent blogs. Famous authors sometimes use second names. Pseudonyms

(pen names) are suggested. Who is Richard Bachman? (novelist Stephen King uses an alias).



When you are looking for content to "boost" the look of the Student-made Website (the Digital Portfolio), ask, "What could I add that will make this portfolio pop?" Answer: A book. Create your own book by uploading a Word document and attach a free ISBN. You're a self-published author and one book costs around \$3.
