Ogasawara Islands

What's it about? Travel Guide **of** Ogasawara Island, how to get there, and when to get there.

The course introduces the attractions **of** the Ogasawara Islands listed as a natural World Heritage Site **in** 2011. The five-night, six-day trip (including two nights **on** board) uses the passenger ship Ogasawara-maru, which runs once every six days and is the only access **to** the archipelago. The course is ideal **for** anyone seeking to relax **on** a tropical island or enjoy physical activity **in** vast nature. Visits **to** the Ogasawara Islands generally center **on** the two inhabited islands: Chichijima and, south **of** it, Hahajima. This tour offers the experience **of** nature **on** Chichijima, served by Ogasawara-maru. We only offer trips from the boat **at** 6:00am and **at** 8:00pm. If you want to leave **at** another time, please schedule it with your trip coordinator.

**** From 6:00am to 8:00pm** → Between a period of time, the whole time between.

**** at 6:00am and at 8:00pm** → Only specifically two times.

Look at the prepositions in **Bold**:

1) Think of a rule for when to use “in”

year, inside of something e.g. in 2011, coffee is in a cup. in (place) e.g. in Tokyo.

2) Think of a rule for when to use “on”

on (surface) e.g. on the table, on (special dates) On Christmas, on holiday, on vacation,
on time vs. in time

- on time→ Class starts at 8:00am, come on time. (you arrive at or before 8:00am)

- in time → I just got to class in time (class starts at 8:00am) You're on time, arrive at 7:59am, 8:00am.

3) Think of a rule for when to use "at"

specific time, come at 9:00pm. i was there at 3:11pm. I'm at the door (exactly next to the location) at → inside (I'm at the library) vs. by → next to (I'm by the library)
