Who is the BAI Program for?

- First-year administrators (excluding superintendents)
 - Principal
 - **Assistant Principal**
 - Curriculum Administrator
 - Special Education Administrator
- *Administrators from out-of-state with previous experience; and
- *Administrators returning to the profession

*Please note the only requirement for administrators who have experience out-of-state or those returning to the profession is to attend TESS Credentialing. All other trainings and support are optional.

Required Components of the Beginning Administrator Induction Program:
