Lesson Title

Hola Spanish!

Duration

1Hour

Lesson Plan

- 1. **Welcome and Introduction (5 minutes)**
- Greet the students with "Hola" and introduce them to the Spanish language.
- Briefly discuss the importance of learning different languages and cultures.
- 2. **Basic Spanish Greetings (10 minutes)**
- Teach students simple greetings: Hola (Hello), Adiós (Goodbye), Buenos días (Good morning), Buenas noches (Good night).
- Practice with a quick interactive game: the teacher says a greeting in English and students respond in Spanish.

- 3. **Numbers 1-10 (10 minutes)**
- Introduce the numbers 1 to 10 in Spanish using flashcards.
- Engage students with a counting song in Spanish.
- 4. **Colors in Spanish (10 minutes)**
- Introduce basic colors: rojo (red), azul (blue), verde (green), amarillo (yellow).
- Play a game where students identify colored objects around the classroom and say the color in Spanish.
- 5. **Simple Phrases and Commands (10 minutes)**
- Teach phrases like "Por favor" (Please), "Gracias" (Thank you), and "Lo siento" (Sorry).
- Role-playing activity where students use these phrases in simple scenarios.
- 6. **Wrap-Up and Review (10 minutes)**
- Review the greetings, numbers, colors, and phrases learned.
- Encourage students to share what they enjoyed the most and what they want to learn next.

Materials List

- Flashcards with Spanish greetings, numbers, and colors
- Lyrics and music for a counting song in Spanish
- Colored objects or images for the color identification game

Adaptations for Different Ages

- **Younger Children: ** Use more songs and rhymes to help with memorization. Keep activities shorter and more visually engaging.
- **Older Children: ** Introduce additional vocabulary or simple sentences. Encourage writing words in Spanish and having mini conversations.

Movement Break

- Halfway through the lesson, incorporate a 5-minute movement break with a "Simon Says" game in Spanish: "Simón dice toca la cabeza" (Simon says touch your head).

Bonus Activities

- **Create a Spanish Picture Dictionary: ** Have students draw and color pictures related to the vocabulary and write the Spanish word below each drawing.
- **Spanish Scavenger Hunt: ** Organize a scavenger hunt where students find items of particular colors or numbers around the classroom and say the word in Spanish when they find them.

- Introduction to Spanish-speaking countries with a world map activity.
- Learn basic greetings and goodbyes through role-play.
- Create a Spanish word wall for newly learned vocabulary.

- Learn names of common foods with sorting activities.
- Play a market game to practice buying and selling with food items.
- **Week 6: Animals and Nature**
- Visit a local zoo or show animal pictures and learn Spanish names.
- Create a "Spanish Safari" booklet with drawings and labels.
- Learn a song or rhyme featuring animals in Spanish.

- **Week 7: Days, Months, and Weather**
- Create a weather chart and discuss daily in Spanish.
- Make a calendar to practice days and months vocabulary.
- Conduct simple weather experiments and describe results in Spanish.
- **Week 8: Clothing and Fashion**
- Dress-up activity using Spanish vocabulary for clothing.
- Fashion show where students describe outfits in Spanish.
- Design a paper doll wardrobe with labeled clothing items.
- **Week 9: Emotions and Expressions**
- Role-play scenarios expressing different emotions using Spanish vocabulary.
- Use emoticons to match with Spanish words for feelings.
- Create an "emotions wheel" in Spanish to use in discussions.
- **Week 10: Review and Cultural Celebration**
- Organize a mini Spanish fair with cultural presentations by students.
- Review all vocabulary through interactive games and activities.
- Celebrate with a fiesta featuring music, dances, and food from Spanish-speaking cultures.
