Creating beautiful native plant landscapes will help save the earth and money, too!

A film for our times, "Hometown Habitat" illustrates how and why native plants are vital to the survival and vitality of our local ecosystems, and to our own survival! Renowned educator Douglas Tallamy shows how landscaping with non-natives has caused habitat and species loss worldwide, and how we (individuals and communities) can turn the tide for the better—right now—in our own yards and neighborhoods.

For two years, Catherine Zimmerman traveled the country to film educational and inspiring stories of communities committed to conservation landscaping. Her message will inspire you—all of us have the power to support biodiversity and bring natural beauty to our patch of the Earth.
