#### **SUMMER KNOCKOUTS 2025**

## **SINGLES**

All matches are played off the White Tees.

All matches to be played off Full Course Handicap.

Strokes to be given by the lowest handicapper I.E. If Player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  plays off 13 Course Handicap, and Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  plays off 21 Course Handicap, Then Player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  plays of scratch (0) and Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  plays off 8.

Another example: if Player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  plays of 23 Course Handicap and Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  plays of 26 Course Handicap, Then player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  plays of Scratch, and Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  plays off 3.

It is deemed that the player on top of the drawn pairing (I E Player A) (in Red) is the home player. So it is his responsibility to arrange the match up to the cut off date on top of the Draw Sheet.

MAXIMUM COURSE HANDICAP IS 28. Player with higher Course Handicap may play off Max.

## **PAIRS**

One player must be under 20 Course Handicap and one player 20 or over Course Handicap. Two 20 or over Course Handicap players may play together but one must be nominated to play off 19 Course Handicap throughout the competition.

All matches to be played off the **White Tees.** 

MAXIMUM COURSE HANDICAP IS 28. Player with higher Course Handicap may play off Max.

All matches to be played 90% of the difference in **Course Handicap**, off the lowest handicapper.

# **Example.** Players $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ and $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$ Versus Player $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ and $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$

Player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  plays off 14 Course Handicap, Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  plays off 21 Course Handicap, Player  $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$  plays off 17 Course Handicap, and player  $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$  plays off 22 Course Handicap.

Then Player  $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$  (who is the lowest Handicap therefore gives the shots) plays off Scratch, the difference between him and Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  is 7, so Player  $\underline{\mathbf{B}}$  gets 90% of 7 which is 6, Player  $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ , Difference is 3, so 90% of 3 is 3, and player  $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ , Difference is 8, so 90% of 8 is 7.

The pair on top of the Draw (in Red) is the home team, so they have to arrange date for the match. 1st round to be played by 31st May2025.

#### Please Note.

Previously the fixtures in the Knock-out matches (Singles & Doubles) worked very well, so this year we intend to do the same, being rigid in keeping with the dates on the draw. So, the player on top of the draw (in red), deemed to be the home player, will give his opponent 3 dates in which to play their match within the allotted dead line date.

If the opposing player cannot meet any of the 3 dates, and no compromised date is reached between them, then the tie will be decided by a toss of a coin.

This ruling will also apply to the Doubles Matches, if one of the partners cannot make the dates, then the match can go ahead with the format of 2 vs 1, or a coin toss.
