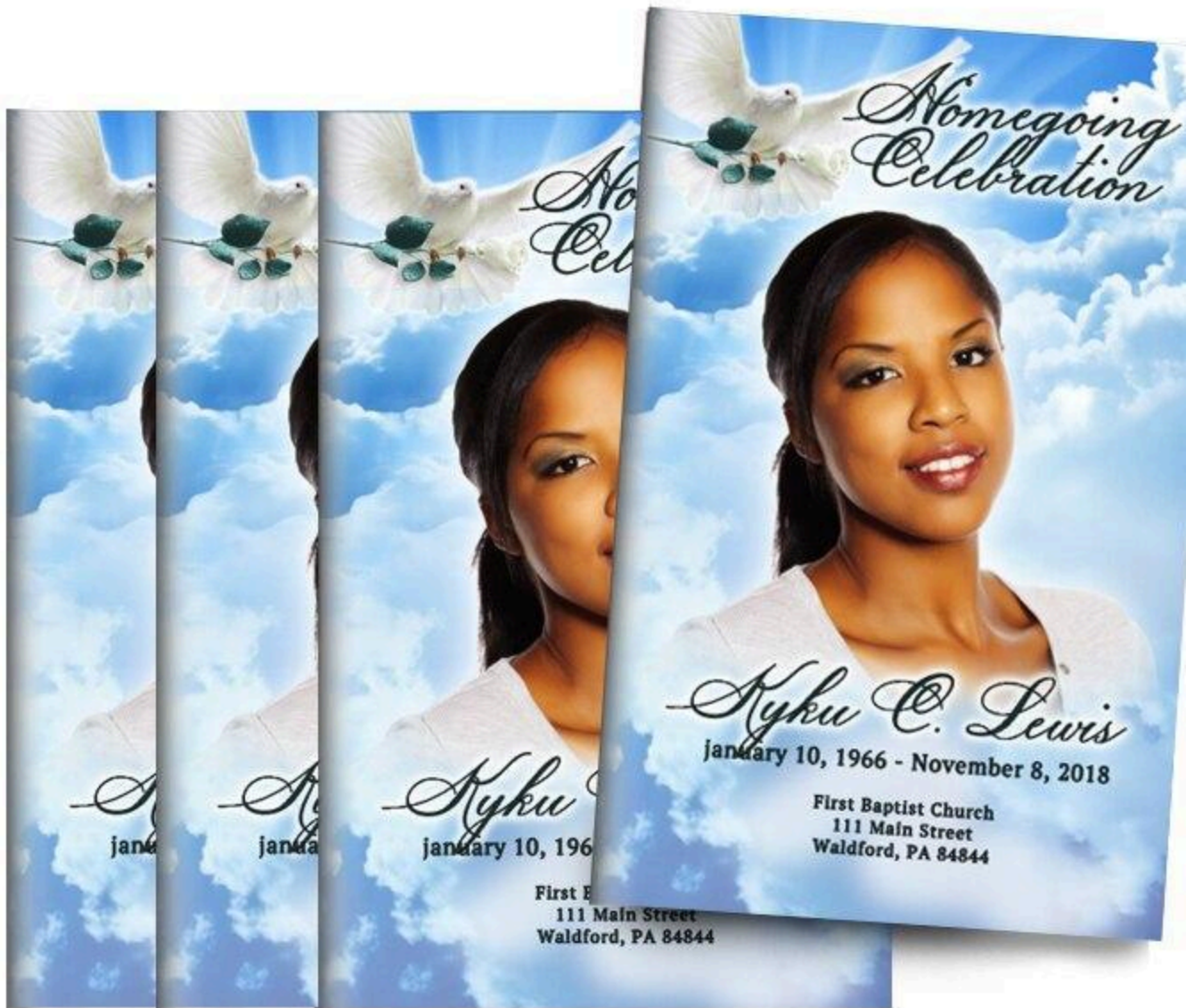


Funeral Program

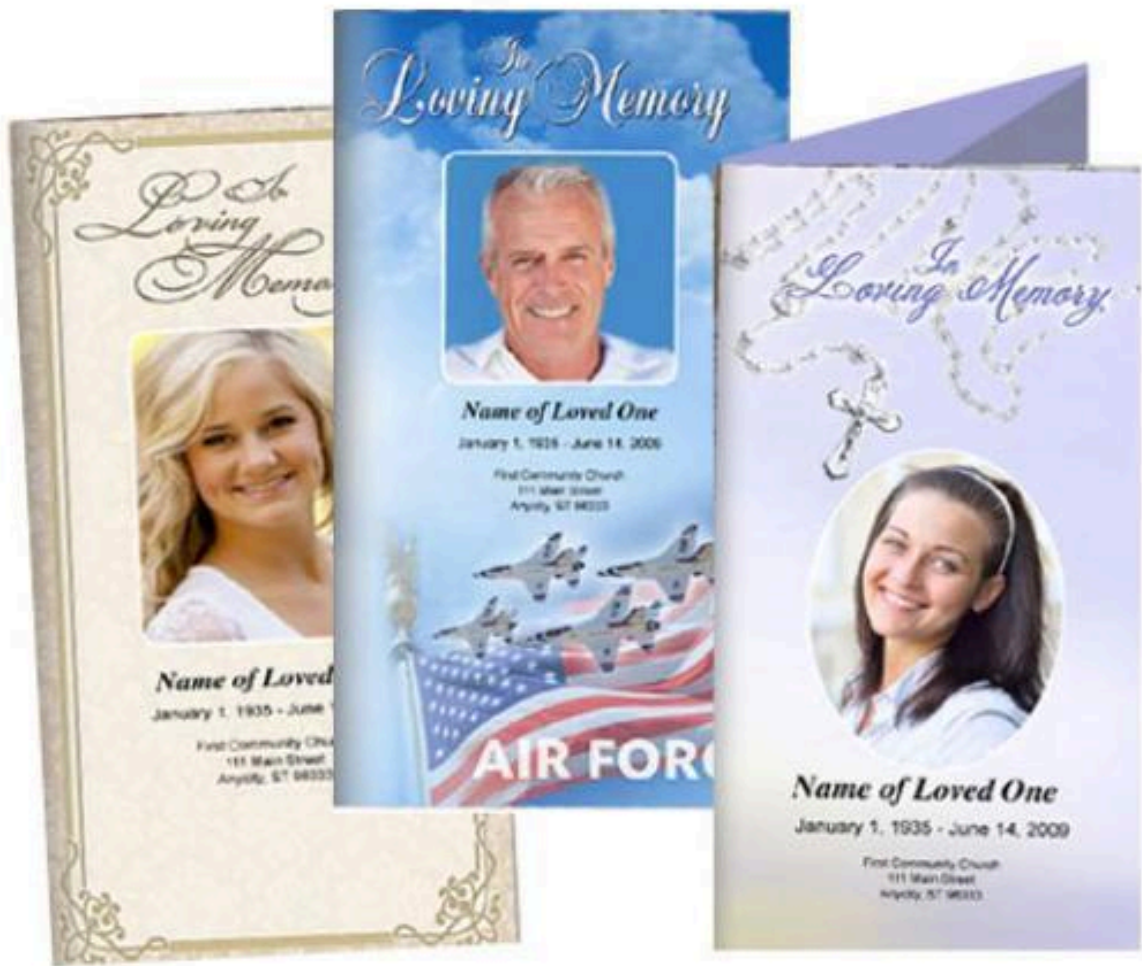
