



Languedoc G2 #1 [The Blonde/Old Reliable] (24 frets) - built November 1987, flamed curly Maple top, Paduak sides and back; this 'doc had the single coil in the middle position (originally) and two humbuckers. There were three knobs, one for volume and two for tone I think. One mini switch for parallel & series wiring I believe, then the three-way pickup selector. This is the guitar seen in the Clifford Ball DVD's and at every show from '88 up until Fall '96. This original has Languedoc's Time-style headstock before deciding on the Vermont shape; with the inlay of puppy Marley sitting with a thought bubble that reads "Who's the mar-mar?". The (possibly DiMarzio) single coil pickup was removed by '92 and filled with a piece of carved Ebony which looks like a dummy pickup. This is valid because you can't see the magnet poles on the Clifford Ball pic, compared to the Halloween pic. The single coil was re added February 2015. This guitar has **Schaller Golden 50** humbuckers where the rest of the Languedoc guitars have **Seymour Duncan** '59 humbuckers, until 2015 the Koa guitars integrated Seymour Duncan SH3 Stag Mag humbuckers.

In Trey's most recent rig rundown video taken at <u>Jones Beach 2012</u>, he says this guitar is usually at home, however we know he brought it onstage (behind Page's Fender Rhodes) at the MSG 2013-14 run and in fact used this guitar for the <u>JEMP truck set on 12/31</u>. <u>Neil Young used this guitar onstage for Farm Aid '98</u> and in 2010 Trey used this guitar on <u>Conan O'Brien's show for Alaska</u>. <u>At some point (before Conan 2010), the third knob had been removed and replaced by a mini switch for single-coil/humbucker select, making same controls as the other G2's.</u> Used for Sample through Wolfman's on 12/31/14.





February 2015, Tom Marshall tweeted two photos saying Trey had the single coil pickup put back in. Used at <u>Terrapin Crossroads on 5/1/15</u>. Used for the entire GD50 run in 2015 and in Del Valle, TX with Phish.

Languedoc G2 #2 - Spruce top, quilted Maple sides and back, volume knob, tone knob, three-way pickup selector, (no parallel/series and single-coil switches...yet), and two humbuckers. This one has the inlay of Marley chasing a cat. The headstock is in the shape of Vermont, like the current G2 models being built by Paul today. It should be noted that this guitar was built in August '91 and was <u>rarely used live</u>, but was on stage. Trey used this guitar in the Hoist sessions, <u>Tracking</u>, and before it got refinished, onstage with Oysterhead in 2001 on <u>Conan O'Brien</u>. In 2012 Trey used this guitar on the Jimmy Fallon show with TAB playing Ooh Child (*amp note: Trey used a <u>Mesa Royal Atlantic combo</u> for Fallon). Trey used this guitar with TAB for the 2014 Fall tour and with Phish in Miami 2014-15. Single coil pickup added for GD50 reunion.

*NOTE: There are a few theories on this guitar's new look. Rumor is there are two #2's with the same headstock but different fretboards and bodies; I do not buy that. It is also said the <u>original wood</u> <u>became structurally unstable and only the neck was salvaged</u>... but why not the fretboard? Fretboard refinishes are challenging but doable and adding a few switches is pretty simple.

This is the guitar that Paul refinished in the Tobacco type burst and added the two mini switches for parallel/series wiring and single-coil/humbucker select. The fret board has also been redone as the inlays are different but headstock is the same. Paul also incorporated carbon graphite into the neck for durability. A new Maple neck may be on there, but I'm not certain.





Languedoc G2 #3 - First flamed all Koa body (Hawaiian, not Brazilian I believe is the status). This is the one that arrived in late 1996 and became the main guitar. After the hiatus Trey used this guitar until fall 2003. Paul's signature is inlayed on the headstock, which is carved in all of Paul's standard production G2 and G4 models. Controls are 1 volume knob and 1 tone knob. Pickup selector switch and then the mini switches for parallel/series wiring & single-coil/humbucker select; which becomes the standard controls for all G2 and G4 guitars here-after. Brought to GD50 reunion. Used in Bend, both CA shows, and Grand Prairie summer 2015 (humbuckers Seymour Duncan SH3 Stag Mags).

This Koa guitar is also used backstage and I believe has not been used onstage since fall 2003; except for SPAC 2010 Gotta Jibboo where Mike played this guitar with Trey while Tony Markellis played a Steinberger headless bass. Trey was still using the lighter Koa since he would not receive the ocelot guitar until after that leg. Since 2015, Trey has played this guitar onstage on at least a semi regular basis.






Why do you use the pickups you use? - Languedoc.com - FAQ 2009

Pickups are like microphones. They can't make sound, only pick up what's there, get it? The Seymour Duncan SH-1s are copies of the classic Les Paul humbuckers, nicely made, with alnico magnets and not too much wire, so they're fairly low impedance, and they just seem to work well with my guitars. I modify them slightly so that in single-coil mode with both pickups on they are hum-canceling, and I also pot them. And yes, they are the same pickups in Trey's guitars. If someone had a strong preference for something else I'd be glad to accommodate, but I've tried other pickups in my guitars and I always come back to the Duncans.


Languedoc G2 #4 - second flamed all Koa body, but a lighter Koa with two darker flamed stripes. This one was built in 2002, but used with Phish from late '03 and through Coventry. It can also be seen used with TAB and his other bands. Trey used this guitar as the main axe at the 2009 Hampton Reunion continuing through all Phish shows leading to the Greek run in 2010 leg 2 summer tour. Trey used this guitar when he sat in with Furthur in 2013 @ Lock'n [amp was Bogner Shiva]. Brought to GD50 reunion.



Languedoc G2 #5 – Highly flamed dark all Koa body. This third Koa guitar was obtained during the summer 2010 touring break; features an ocelot on the headstock with a sunset for extra detail and Ebony covering the truss rod adjustment; also has Cocobolo binding and a unique inlay at the 12th & 24th frets. Used from Atlanta through the end of 2015 (new humbuckers Seymour Duncan SH3 Stag Mags).

As of 2013 - present, Trey will switch back and forth between this guitar and his last Koa (as of fall 2014) and his older, pre-Koa guitars. Any of these guitars are Trey's main stage instruments whether it's Phish, TAB, a sit-in, or Orchestra performance.










Page's Languedoc G2 - The green doc was used by Trey at Easter Jam 4/11/04 at the Higher Ground and at Fenway Park '09 for Time Turns Elastic; also seen at Cincinnati and Miami '09. The body wood combination is not known, but I strongly believe it is quilted Maple. This is the Languedoc guitar owned by Page. Confirmed by Kevin Shapiro, Paul gave this guitar to Page as a gift. Cincinnati 2009 Divided Sky.




Languedoc G2 Koa #4 - Trey displayed this guitar on Facebook and Instagram January 2021 indicating 4.0. This guitar looks very similar to the first Koa G2 from 1996; however the main differences are the tuning machines, the pickup spacing of the bridge pickup is slightly closer to the fretboard than previous G2's, the white binding is also not plastic compared to the previous Koa guitars which do have plastic; this guitar has Holly wood binding. And just like the 2016 doc, features Ebony pickup rings and truss rod cover.

Trey's acoustic guitar was made by the late Michael Wentzell of South Carolina, whose website (no longer active) includes this description:

"This guitar is a very unique combination of woods. The sides and back are made of quilted Honey Mahogany, the top is Larch, the bridge and bindings are made of flamed Maple, and the rossette and headcap are also of quilted Mahogany. The neck is Honey Mahogany while the fingerboard is Ebony."




The elusive Languedoc FISH bass

Built by Paul in 1987, stolen on 5/11/1989 in Albany. Named for its headstock inlay, the bass has a two piece curly Maple body with an interior chamber, a Koa top with an F-hole and multiple-layered binding. Controls include only one knob, which blends between the two EMG ASB-5 pickups. Mike eventually wanted to add a piezo bridge transducer to accentuate the highs of the instrument's hollow body.





In Mike's 2002 documentary with Gov't Mule, Rising Low, Mike demonstrates what he feels like it means to play with the environment. The shot starts with Mike standing at the fork in a road actually playing the Fish bass (F hole and single knob) then the shot changes setting with Mike standing at the exact place in the frame.

This Youtube video shows this scene (14:19) and another scene at (22:09). This leads me to believe Mike has the Fish bass stashed somewhere at home, which does not surprise me since Mike probably wouldn't want to risk touring with this bass. The Koa top looks absolutely beautiful.



Languedoc Dragon bass

Named for its intricate headstock inlay, the Dragon bass (built by Paul in 1989) has a five-piece curly Maple neck and a bound Ebony fingerboard. The body is solid Koa, with a face of curly Maple veneer. The bridge and tuning machines were made by Schaller. Mike custom-ordered the instrument's active, 18-volt Mørch pickups from Denmark; they came with a myriad of knobs and switches Mike didn't really want. Quoted: "I have trouble making decisions, I probably change my instrument settings only every two years."


Used in 1990 but became his stage bass from '91 through '96 where Mike would fully use Modulus basses (He tried them in Fall '94). Used on 12/31/13 for the JEMP truck set.

The three larger knobs on the bass control volume (one per pickup) and pickup blend; the four mini switches and three smaller knobs are for various mid-range contours and high and low boosts. Languedoc comments, "Even I don't know what they all do!"

Modulus Quantum 5 - Used briefly during Fall 1994; it is unknown whether the bass was rented, bought, or borrowed. Modulus, known for their Carbon fiber Graphite aerospace composite necks; this bass is made from Alder wood with a Cocobolo top and appears to have a dark red finish. This bass has a bolt-on neck and looks to contain EMG pick-ups.



Modulus Quantum 5 - Used from February '97 through hiatus. I'm not sure whether this is the same bass used in '94. If so, he must have bought it. Mike actually used this bass for the acoustic set at Clifford Ball. Mike also owns a black Q5 with a bolt-on neck (*recent picture above).







Jonathan Kelsey headless bass

Used for the 12/30/12 DWD

"Built by luthier Jonathan Kelsey, the body is available with different woods and features chambers cut out to control the weight and balance. The neck, though Maple to the touch, is carbon fiber for sustain and elimination of dead spots.

Pickups on the bass include a pair of specially arched EMGs and a piezo in the bridge. The EMGs can be selected via a switch, and a blend knob allows for blending the EMGs and the piezo for tonal variety."










Looks to be a more-or-less exact replica of his primary Walnut bass. A less intense of a quilt to this Walnut top.







A Drum magazine <u>interviewed</u> Fishman before the 2014 summer tour so they did not know of the downsized kit. This description has both snares and many, many cymbals as well as the Harry Hood bongos, etc. His current downsized <u>black kit</u> (2014) is Yamaha hardware. For the 10/31/14 Haunted Halloween set Fishman used this kit. 2015, Fishman has returned to the Eames, looks to be adding back more of his extra percussion pieces little by little. In 2016, the black kit has became the stage kit again.



Drum set is a restored 1983 model with Camco lugs throughout. Jon Fishman also uses Sonor Jojo Mayer Perfect Balance bass drum pedal, Gibraltar Road Series rack, Remo heads, Vic Firth sticks, Roc N' Soc throne, and hardware from Pearl, DW, Ludwig, and Yamaha.

(<u>Sarno Earth drive</u> -> Fender DR @ 8/28/12, Chaiftz Arena, St. Louis). Fender Princeton Reverb for Orchestra shows

2013: Bogner Shiva combo (and head only at MSG) were substituted (Mesa there but not always primary) for the Fender DR. Fulltone Tube Tape Echo (implemented mid fall tour). Swart Spacetone substituted over PR for Orchestra shows. [JEMP truck set = Wah > 2 Ibanez TS9's (silver modded) > Ross compressor -> Mesa with one Languedoc cabinet]

2014: [Teleprompter removed] Bogner combo and Mesa used back and forth during summer (-> at least one Languedoc cabinet, cabs covered in black tolex for better protection). [Alesis Nanoverbs removed and Microverb fitted with metal to fit its entire rackmount slot] Shin-Ei Uni-Vibe (original Japanese univibe implemented at the New Orleans Jazz Fest) [Leslie and Trek removed, newer model Leslie for guitar implemented BGCA] Fender PR used for the Vegas Halloween set. [Two Mesa heads -> both Languedoc cabs Fall and Miami runs] (Mesa was apparently rebiased to run hotter)

2015: **[with GD]** Brad Sarno of Sarno Music sent Trey a steel guitar black box tube buffer, an early MXR Phase 100, and built a modified MXR Distortion+ clone. He also mentioned a reverb unit and a pair of speakers for Trey to try out. [Mesa (half power) -> 2x12 with Tone Tubby Purple Haze speakers, bottom cab is a 2x12 and is miked]
Guitar humbucker pickups are flipped inverse (look at magnet poles/screws)

[with Phish] No Fulltone Tube Tape Echo or TC Nova Repeater. Tru-Tron and OC2 on floor, Alesis Microverb atop the rack with TS9's, univibe, and H&K Tubefactor, rack unit still has the 2 additional CAE 4x4 MIDI switchers and the TC D-Two. [Mesa head (not always primary) -> both Languedoc cabs, bottom cab miked, top cab being swapped] Bogner Shiva combo and head also is hidden behind the racks (cable going to amp and pilot light on, no mic on combo) Ross compressor in the backside of the rack unit, set to minimum sensitivity.

Fall - Marshall JTM amp head (jumped channels, probably a handwired reissue) [Fender DR & Marshall JTM -> both Languedoc cabs, no Mesa] and Fender Stratocaster onstage

MSG - AM modded TS9's swapped for TS808's (one of which definitely appears vintage), Hughes & Kettner Tube Factor swapped for a gold Klon, also a Lehle switcher and appears the Ross is back in the rack or absent? [Two (Rhythm amp with 6L6's & Lead amp with EL34's) Komet Trainwreck 60 -> two 2x12 Bruno closed back cabinets with Celestion Heritage G1265's and also the Victoria Reverberato has returned]





[Atlanta, GA - 2015 - top cab (built for GD50) is newer]




