

 - During this time, students will hear about post-secondary planning along with the college process.
 - School Counselors will review this presentation with the seniors:

 - Review these slides regularly for the senior year timeline, important links, dates, contact information, Application and Financial Aid information, etc.
 - Students will also receive the Senior guide, Class of 2026 along with the required senior packet which is required for the college application and letter of recommendation process.
 - Students should set up their <u>senior interview</u> with their counselor ASAP.
 These meetings typically last about 45 minutes and we will review a variety of important senior topics. This is especially important to schedule if you plan to apply early

Early College Classes

- University of Maine System (UMS) <u>Early College</u> Updates:
 - Are you interested in taking Early college classes? <u>Talk with your</u> school counselor before applying so that they can share important information. The next time to sign up is in November for their Spring semester which starts in January.
 - See all News and Announcements and Important links <u>HERE</u>
 - Starting with the Class of 2027, qualified students may earn a lifetime total of 18 tuition-free credits. CTE Students in approved career pathways are eligible for an additional 6 credits in their pathway courses for a total of 24 credits.
 - You can read the full DOE Priority Notice here.

- If you are taking an Early College class, pay close attention to emails you receive from the college.
- Reach out directly to your professor or the Early College advisor at your specific college for any concerns or questions. Do this as soon as you have a question/concern. School counselors will also advise you to reach out directly to the college when you have questions.

 - If you want to withdraw from your class, pay careful attention to the specific college deadlines.

- If you fail an Early College class, per their policy, you can not take additional college courses until you repeat the same course.
- The Spring Semester Course registration will open on November 7th. If you are a senior, we will need parent permission for you to take a college class as a graduation requirement.
