3. The Misapplication of Matthew 18:20

- Common but incorrect application: God's presence in small groups.
- Correction: God's presence is constant through Christ, not group size.
- Proper context: reconciliation, not group validation.

4. The True Context of Matthew 18:20

- The passage is rooted in reconciliation and church discipline.
- Goal of Matthew 18 is healthy church culture through low-key, personal conflict resolution.
- Misunderstanding the passage undermines its relational purpose.

5. Biblical Framework for Reconciliation (Matthew 18:15-17)

- **Step 1: Private rebuke**
 - "Rebuke" means a thoughtful, prayerful confrontation.
 - Goal is reconciliation, not condemnation.

- **Step 2: Small group involvement**

- Two or three witnesses validate facts, not form a bias group.
- Offense must be an actual sin, not a personal slight or preference.

- **Step 3: Involvement of the church**

- Church steps in when private attempts fail.
- Always done with love and intent to restore.

6. Purpose and Posture in Church Discipline

- Motivation must be love, not vindication or punishment.
- Primary offense is to God, not just interpersonal hurt.
- Unity in the body depends on confronting sin properly.

7. The Larger Context of Matthew 18

- Parable of the Lost Sheep (preceding) and the Unforgiving Servant (following).
- Scriptural sandwich points to God's heart for reconciliation and grace.
- Emphasizes humility and empathy, especially for the offended.
