Checklist for Routines that Start Class

Before starting this routine with students, explain the routine, model and describe the behaviors you expect, explain the rewards and/or consequences for not meeting expectations, and the reason why the routine is important.

As Students Enter:	
	Greet students at the door
}	Post written expectations for starting class on the board (ie; by the time the timer ends, you will be in your seat, have a pencil, have a book, open your journal) and a Do Now discussion prompt, journal activity, challenge problem, etc)
	Set timer with sound for a predetermined time
	Verbally give the routine expectations after starting bell
	Circulate the room to redirect students
After Timer Goes Off:	
	mmediately respond to timer by verbally cuing students
□ \	Wait for students to demonstrate readiness
	Greet class and debrief with students by using some ideas below: have a student read the expectations give data (ie; how many students met the expectations, how long after the timer we waited) ask for class feedback (ie; how did we do? What do we need to work on? have students share from the Do Now Begin lesson
