The traditional gift for a 5th anniversary is wood – this is apt for a scouting association in lots of ways. Having started as a tiny acorn, CBS is starting to grow into a mighty oak.













CBS started back in May 2014 with a single Beaver Colony. Today it has two Beaver Scout Colonies, two Cub Scout Packs and two Scout Troops. Over the past 5 years CBS has taken hundreds of children through the scouting system – a formative experience that few forget.

One of the highlights of this year was certainly CBS's participation in the event to mark the centenary of the end of World War One. CBS was very proud that over thirty scouts and leaders from Central Brussels Scouts turned out a cold Sunday morning with their family members to honour the war dead at the service at Heverlee Commonwealth War Cemetery on 11 November 2018.

It was just after the war, in 1920, that the 1st World Scout Jamboree took place at London's Kensington Olympia. And nearly a century on, CBS is very proud that two of our scouts will be representing CBS at the 24th World Scout Jamboree in West Virginia, USA later on this year.
