Meeting Notes

Homans Site

 No new meeting between GSNC and the city. City staff hope to be available late March or early April.

Comments by mayoral candidate Jake Wilson in response to questions by attendees (This is not a transcript)

Self Introduction

- Before becoming a City Councilor, led Somerville youth soccer, a large city nonprofit
- We are a city of culture and innovation, yet decisions are slow
- Need to rebuild city workforce, 1 in 8 city jobs are vacant, but it is improving with the new contract
- Two-way communication is of primary importance: broadcasting and feedback
- Gilman Square: Want to get an RFP out for the Homans site as soon as the stormwater issue (i.e. the underground tank) is decided, interested in exploring air rights

North-South Transit?

- Sponsored orders on the Council and Mobility Division about this
- Goal is to connect Somerville Ave to Assembly via Gilman Square using Walnut St., Temple St., and School St with small buses that can manage the hills

Vision of Leadership?

- Important decisions seem like they are being deferred: Highland Ave redesign, school consolidation, Homans site, etc. I will make bold decisions and be accountable
- I will hold regular office hours, prioritize collaboration between city departments, and be receptive to expertise from the community

Location of possible combined Winter Hill and Brown school?

- Need a cohesive plan with a strategic approach
- Each school community wants to keep their current location
- Would consult school committees about future enrollment across schools given additional transit-oriented development to understand impact

If we lose federal funding for things like lowering the McGrath Highway, how do we recoup it?

- There would be tough decisions statewide about immediate needs
- Possibly turn to voters for a Prop 2.5 override for city initiatives if state and federal taxes decline

Safety infrastructure?

- Need to spend money on street resurfacing to enhance safety for all modes of transportation
- Continue traffic calming measures; majority want them on their street
- Work with businesses about parking goals so that we have smart parking tailored for the businesses

10 minute neighborhood? (I.e. Everything you need within a 10 minute walk.)

- Need amenities developed in Gilman Square to reduce car dependence
- City planners need to make sure developers and city projects are responsive to community needs

Safety measures for distracted driving?

- There was a deliberate shift to warnings rather than tickets to build community, may need to shift back
- Traffic camera enforcement for speed, and red light and stop sign enforcement could be necessary

Lack of street parking?

 If we charge more for permits, it could reduce street parking by those with driveways that require tandem parking

Opportunities for this stagnating area?

- Lack of amenities means having to go elsewhere for almost every errand
- We have city-owned land that is easily developable, we need to aggressively activate these parcels
- We're going to make Gilman Square Happen!

- Formalized relationship with Somerville Arts Council for mutual benefit, we are now part of the SomerStreets series
- Looking for a possible theme, one that could be playful or creative
- Will start calls for vendors and artists around late April or May

Western Pearl Street Reconstruction

- Bowman contracted for work, same firm as West Broadway
- Spring review for designs

234-236 Pearl Street

No developments, looking at summertime sale

Piano Building (343 Medford St.)

- Dinner restaurants are interested, because people walk further for dinner
- Potential breakfast and lunch restaurants have backed out due to lack of quick pick-up parking
- Questions around foot traffic through square given T entrances leading people away from square and lack of entrance at Medford and Pearl St
- Summer activation faced same issues, Nibble Kitchen restaurateurs were unwilling to launch a popup on the Homans site without foot traffic data

- Piano Building space is just under 5K sqft
- Can also split the space to host two businesses instead of just one

GSNC Business Development Committee

- GSNC is reviving a committee that had formed before Covid
- Meet with owners of potential project sites in order to encourage business activity
- Local real estate brokers may be able to provide connections
