

Conversation Starters SEL, All Grades

Assignment Objectives

- Students will be able to understand what turns a question into a conversation by using the correct format.
- Paper's Live Help feature will be used for this activity.

Teacher Instructions

- Review the Conversation Starter list with students.
- Review the examples with students.
- Choose one Conversation Starter and model a conversation from start to finish with your students.
- Instruct students to use the list of prompts with a Paper tutor in a Live Help session to create multiple conversations.
- Students will use the graphic organizer to record both the tutor's responses as well as their own.

Ideas for Use

- Pair students together to discuss and share ideas about how they can converse with a Live Help tutor.
- Customize the Conversation Starter list to your students activities and interests.
- Have students brainstorm, along with the help of a tutor, conversation starter prompts that can be added to the list.
- Assign as a homework assignment or warm up activity.

Example 1

Student: What is your favorite color? **Tutor:** My favorite color is green.

Student: My favorite color is purple but I like the

color green, too.

Tutor: Both are great colors, yes!

Example 2

Student: What is your favorite food?

Tutor: I love mac & cheese!

Student: Mac & cheese is my favorite food, too! It is

my favorite thing to eat for dinner!

Tutor: That's so awesome that we have the same

favorite food!

Student Instructions

- 1. Review the Example Conversation.
- 2. Review the Conversations Starters List.
- 3. Open a Live Help session with a tutor and **choose 1**:
 - a. Start a <u>Voice</u> session and say, "I am working on different ways to start a conversation and need help practicing."
 - b. Start a <u>Text</u> session and copy this phrase into the text box: "I am working on different ways to start a conversation and need help practicing."
 - c. Start a <u>Text</u> session and use Voice Typing. Say, "I am working on different ways to start a conversation and need help practicing." Then, review the text that appears on screen to make sure it is correct before sending.
- 4. Ask the tutor each question from the Conversation List.
- 5. Add the tutor's answer below.
- 6. Respond to the tutor by giving your answer. Your response should include an acknowledgement or comment about the tutor's response.
- 7. Add your answer below, next to the tutor's answer.

Example:

Student: What is your favorite color? **Tutor:** My favorite color is green.

Student: My favorite color is purple but I like the color green, too.

Tutor: Both are great colors, yes!
