

ON APPLE DEVICES

On Apple devices (iPhone / iPad)

1) Apple Books (closest to “Kindle feel”)

- Tap the [Download the PDF](#) in Safari.
 - Choose Open in Books.
 - The PDF is saved locally and shows up like a book on your shelf.

2) Files app

- Tap download → Save to Files.
- Open anytime from Files.

Good for storage, less “bookish” than Apple Books.

3) Kindle app (yes, even on iOS)

- [Download the PDF](#).
 - Share → Open in Kindle.

ON ANDROID DEVICES

On Android devices

1) Google Drive

- Tap the link → opens in Drive’s PDF viewer.
 - Choose Make available offline.
-

2) Google Play Books (very Kindle-like)

- [Download the PDF](#).
 - Upload/open it in Play Books.
 - Appears in your library like a book.
-

3) Kindle app for Android

- [Download PDF](#).
 - Share → Kindle.
-

SEND A PDF TO THE KINDLE

1) Send the PDF to your Kindle

- Email the PDF to your Send-to-Kindle address (it's in your Amazon account).
 - Subject line can be blank.
 - Amazon delivers it to your Kindle over Wi-Fi.

2) Use the Kindle app

- Open the PDF in the Kindle app on iPad, phone, or computer.
-

3) Copy via USB

- Plug Kindle into your computer.
- Drag the PDF into the Documents folder.
- Eject → read.

4) Send the PDF to a Kindle

You can read the digital book on a Kindle by sending the PDF to your device.

Step 1

Download the PDF using the link above.

Step 2

From your computer or phone, email the PDF file to your Kindle email address.

(Each Kindle has a unique email address. Amazon provides this with your Kindle.)

Step 3

Turn on Wi-Fi on your Kindle.

The book will appear in your library.

Finding your Kindle email address

1. Sign in to your Amazon account
2. Go to Account → Devices → Kindle
3. Your Kindle email address will be listed there
