Each class will meet twice a week on either Mondays+Wednesdays *OR* Tuesdays+Thursdays. There is no summer school on Fridays. Your student will have asynchronous (online) work for the days they are not in class.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

- **To register for summer school classes** before the end of the school year, please reach out to your student's school counselor. For those looking to register for summer school *after* the end of the school year, there will be one day of **in-person registration** on Monday, June 29, from 4-6pm at Bristol Central High School in the library. **Only students who are not already registered for summer school need to attend the in-person registration.**
- Summer school is free of charge for Bristol residents.
- **Transportation** is not provided to/from summer school.
- **Student Attendance/Behavior Policy:** If a student misses more than 2 days of summer school, he/she may be removed from the program. Students will be expected to treat all staff and students at summer school with respect -- failure to do so may result in removal from the summer school program.
- If a student failed any course(s) listed above, but failed only one semester of the course, he/she will only be required to attend summer school for half of the summer school session. He/she will only have to attend the first half of summer school (July 6 - July 21) if they failed the course for the year, but failed the first semester only. He/she will only have to attend the second half of summer school (July 22 - August 6) if they failed the course for the year, but failed the second semester only. If a student passed the course for the year but failed a semester, they do not need to attend summer school.
- If a student is only attending summer school for one failed class, transportation must be arranged so that he/she is dropped off before the start of the failed class and then picked up immediately after the failed class.
- **Food Services:** Breakfast and a grab-and-go lunch will be available each day to students.
