Taking an AP course and exam is a collaborative effort between the student, parent/guardian, teacher, and school. Each party plays an important role in the AP program and a commitment to meet the expectations noted below.

I. Registration

- a. AP courses require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25 and/or a subject-area GPA of 3.25.
- b. Students must obtain parent/guardian signature and teacher recommendation for all registered AP courses
- c. Final decisions for AP courses will depend on evaluation by the AP Committee and availability. AP courses are appropriate for the highest-achieving students.
- d. Some factors in determining AP selection may include: GPA, test scores (ACT, PLAN, End-of-Course Exams, etc.), attendance, and other factors that are important to rigorous academic work.
- e. **AP registration forms are due by February 14th**. Due to potential Summer assignments through your AP instructor, as well as materials ordering and planning, <u>you may not be able to add AP in the Fall</u>. It is important to register during regular course registration in the Spring if you want to take an AP class.

II. Expectations / Requirements

- a. Students must take the AP exam in May. Each AP test costs \$50 (actual price is \$91, Sandy Valley waives \$41).

 Students on free/reduced lunch typically qualify for a partial or full fee waiver)
- b. Students are required to stay in the AP class, unless recommended by the teacher/principal/counselor that they drop
- c. Dropping an AP course, as with all year-long courses, will result in class failure and a grade of an "WF" will be issued
