Ephesians 6:1-4 - Really Real Relationships (Children) Sunday, May 7, 2023

1. If there was one thing you could change about your parents, what would it be?

Reflecting on the Passage

- 1. Read Ephesians 6:1-4 aloud. What words, phrases or ideas catch your attention or raise a question for you?
- 2. Why is a child's obedience to his or her parents pleasing to the Lord? (v. 1)
- 3. How is obedience to parents part of a child's obligation to Christ? (v. 1)
- 4. What does it mean to "honor your father and mother"? (vss 2-3)
- 5. What was promised to the Israelites who honored their parents? (vss 2-3)
- 6. How does God's commandment and promise hold true today?
- 7. What does God want fathers to do and not to do? (v. 4)
- 8. How should children be reared and nourished? (v. 4)

Reflecting on your Life

- 9. What from this passage can you use to 1) encourage a believer or, 2) share the gospel with an unbeliever?
- 10. Many young couples are anxious about having children and starting a family because of the challenging times in which we live. How do the instructions from this passage offer hope and assurance for such parents?
- 11. Why should parents pay attention to their child's natural inclinations and interests?
- 12. How can a parent avoid exasperating his or her children?
- 13. Why is it easier for children to obey fair and loving parents rather than unreasonable and demanding parents?
- 14. At Trinity, when a baby is dedicated in a worship service, we read aloud from our Trinity Commitment the following: We promise to bring up those in our care in the training and instruction of the Lord, and by a pure and loving example to seek the salvation of our family and friends. What are some intentional ways we do this as a church? What are some creative ways we could grow to do this more?
