Another very deliberate plan is to have our big 'official opening event' mid Term 2, rather than as soon as we move in. We want our ākonga to be involved with the planning and preparing for an opening event which represents them and their school. It will also mean that invited guests will be able to see our learning communities in action and ākonga engaged in learning as part of the special day.

Our focus continues to be a smooth transition into our new learning spaces, creating a sense of belonging for our ākonga and maintaining the exciting learning in our learning communities.

Our staff have been VERY busy sorting through resources and furniture and packing. We have been really pleased to pass on items no longer needed to our OPS community. Keep an eye on the book and furniture by our gate (by temporary admin) as new books and furniture are being added each day. This week we started moving some of the administration and resources into the new building.

We are very conscious that there is a lot of information to share before the end of the term with whānau about our move and the start of Term 2. We will continue to add to our 'Whānau Questions' on our website, there will be a Term 2 information section in next week's newsletter and we will send an update by email in the holidays before Term 2 starts.

## **Opening Up Our School Site!**

On Monday the access behind the new building opened up again. We are all very happy to have our school more connected again - especially those in the rooms who have had to walk the long way to get to the field and office. Our ākonga have been delighted to move through this space, look into the new building and try out the new drinking fountains.

The sculpture which used to be at the entrance of our school was stored off site during the building process and has been placed so that it's visible as you walk into our new admin area and when our ākonga can see it as they move through the school. ## School Car Park - Staff and Visitors Only Please

Our Health and Safety committee works to identify potential risks in schools and we have a legal responsibility under Health and Safety legislation to ensure the school and car park are safe for staff, children, whānau and visitors to our site. The car park in front of our new building is a potential risk area. Our children see it as part of the school and forget to treat it as a road, and drivers often see it as a road and don't always look for children.

The school car park is for Staff and visitors to park in only. Whānau are not able to use this space for parking when picking up or dropping children to school. This is to keep our children who are using this area safe. We appreciate your support with this.

While parking on the streets bordering our school is very limited, there are a lot of options close by. We ask that you consider parking away from the main entries and walking a little way to school, or park in the public carpark down Gerard Beeson Drive (off Arthur Street).

## **OPS Litter Audit**

On Tuesday a group of students worked with Tamaki W.R.A.P. and Mrs Arthur to check the litter sorting in our school. We found that on the whole most people were doing a good job with their sorting. There were a couple of areas we could improve on. We found that we were not getting a lot of worm food or recycling in our bins, although what we had was fairly well sorted.

We would like to encourage our students to sort their litter at school and will continue to focus on this next term in the new building. Please reinforce this process at home by sending students with food lunches that have recyclable packaging where possible.



Next Thursday 6 April will be our last ice block sales until Term 4.





The programme, Te Whakangārahu Ngātahi | Planning Together, is focused on preparing for the upcoming changes to planning and reporting legislation and requirements.

They need your voice and help co-creating these supports, to ensure they are fit for purpose and add value where it is needed.
