- Linda Hulbert: "From the time we walked in we felt at home."

- Laurie Levin: "I tell everybody who I meet that this is my home."

- **Commitment to children and future generations**

- Linda Hulbert: "We want [Bet Shalom] to thrive... obviously for us and then for our children and grandchildren who are here."
- Dick and Debby McNeil: "Heart reasons go to our kids and thinking about future generations."

- **Belief in long-term Jewish continuity, a desire to ensure the synagogue — and the Jewish people — thrive and survive for generations to come**
