 - Response from Rob Winningham: A lot is determined by the legislative session. Will the TRU universities get additional funding or





- change the model for student success on how we are funding? We also have opportunities to bring in additional revenue.

- Comment: I'm not clear on the FDE calculations. There appears to be a range, I'm not sure how that was changed or if it's the same.
 - **Response:** The intent was not to change those calculations.
 - **Response:** I recall that the main issue was the language the FTE had. Now it's adding the FTE of all faculty members instead of considering them as "half".
- Proposed Amendment #1 In Article two, Section two, it states that
 only eligible faculty as defined by the division bylaws may vote in a
 Senator election. This eligibility is actually defined in our charter.
 Therefore, we would like it amended to state that eligible faculty as
 defined in the faculty senate charter may vote in a Senator election.

- **Proposed Amendment #2** Article three, section one, item four, the term of holding office is described. We would like to amend those to state that a term for Secretary/Vice President is one year, the President's term is two years (1st year as President, 2nd year as Past President), and At-Large Senator's term shall be two years. Additionally, in article three, section two, which covers election procedure, we would like to add an item stating that elections for At-Large Senators shall be staggered with two At-Large Senators being elected to the Executive Committee every year.

- Motion to accept bylaws with proposed amendments. Motion Seconded.
 - **Comment:** It did not used to be the case that business needed to be voted on to be brought forward. I'd like to have clarification on that procedure. My second clarification is with the clickers, since it has always been a vocal vote. I'd like to do away with bringing





business forward if it's on the agenda, and do away with the voting clickers.

- **Response:** Those practices are in the faculty senate rules of order that were voted last year. We can pull those up to reexamine them.
- **Question**: If the president wants to see a second term, are they allowed to do this? How does this work under the bylaws?
 - **Response:** I don't believe the bylaws comment on it specifically. It is only stated that if the president would like to continue serving, they have to be elected again.

6.1. 2022/2023-26 <u>University Names Policy</u> (Amy Clark, Registrar's Office)

 - **Question:** What is the past practice, and why is this policy needed?
 - **Response:** We had a preferred name field, where it needed to be manually changed, it's a very clunky system. What we are looking for is to allow those names to be automatically changed in the systems
 - Question: Do you encounter students who are experimenting with names? And how would this policy withstand if a student wishes to change their name multiple times?
 - **Response:** We are managing that through the preferred name, and this policy will help to make that easier.





- Question: If someone wants to change their name, once they submit that request, will that immediately show up in my class list and degree tracks?
 - **Response**: Correct.
- **Question:** Will this also affect the email address?
 - **Response:** People are able to change their email address, so this will be an issue we will work with UCS to implement.
