MINNESOTA AUTHOR VISIT BRINGS HISTORY TO LIFE

WMS 6th graders had a special opportunity on Friday, November 21st, when Minnesota author William Durbin visited to speak with students. His visit came after students finished reading his debut novel, The Broken Blade, in their Minnesota History classes.

Durbin's book follows a young Voyageur on his first journey from Montreal to Grand Portage during the fur trade era, making it a perfect tie-in to Minnesota History state standards. Students were excited to hear firsthand about his writing process, historical research, and the real stories that inspired the novel.

The Minnesota Polar Plunge Overview

The Polar Plunge is the **biggest annual fundraiser for Special Olympics Minnesota** (SOMN).

- What It Is: It is a series of events held across the state where individuals and teams raise money for Special Olympics, and then take a quick, chilling jump into the freezing waters of a Minnesota lake or a mobile plunge pool ("Plungester") during the winter months.
- **The Requirement:** Participants generally must raise a minimum amount of money (often \$75) to take the Plunge. Those who prefer to stay dry can often participate as a "Too Chicken to Plunge" donor.

How Participation Helps Special Olympics

All funds raised by Polar Plunge participants directly benefit **Special Olympics Minnesota**. Your participation provides year-round support for thousands of athletes with intellectual disabilities across the state. This includes:

- Year-Round Training and Services: Funding for sports training, equipment, and services for athletes.
- **Competitive Experience:** Support for athletes to compete in local, state, and even national/world Special Olympics games.
- **Promoting Inclusion:** Helping the organization work toward creating a world that accepts and welcomes every single person, regardless of ability.

How Participation Helps Schools

The Polar Plunge has a specific program designed for students and staff called the **"Cool Schools Plunge"** or a revenue-sharing model that provides direct benefits to participating schools:

- Revenue Share Program: Special Olympics Minnesota offers a Revenue Share opportunity for school teams.
 - Unified Champion Schools (UCS): Schools designated as UCS—which promote inclusion and acceptance—can have 50% of the funds they raise online redirected back to their Unified club or similar inclusive programming. All ISD 110 schools are UCS schools.
 - Other School Teams: Other school teams, clubs, or classes can receive a 35% share of the online funds they raise.
- **Funding Inclusive Programs:** The money schools receive is often used to support their local inclusive efforts, such as:

- Buying new uniforms for unified sports teams (which include students with and without intellectual disabilities).
- Covering transportation costs to sporting events.
- Supporting other inclusion efforts like Best Buddies or Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) programs within the school.
- **Building Community:** The event fosters a sense of unity, teamwork, and a culture of inclusion among the students and staff.

UPCOMING READING ASSESSMENT (repeat from two weeks ago)

As part of our ongoing commitment to improve our abilities to support every student's reading growth, Waconia Middle School will be using a new statewide reading assessment tool, Capti ReadBasix, for students who are reading below grade level, as indicated by the September FastBridge (FAST) reading assessment. Capti ReadBasix will provide our staff with additional insight into your students' reading strengths and help to identify specific areas of growth. Results will be used to help guide instruction and ensure that all students continue to develop into skilled readers.

The Capti ReadBasix will take about thirty minutes to measure Word Recognition and Decoding, Vocabulary, Morphology, and Reading Efficiency. Students are scheduled to take it during our scheduled academic WILD time on November 20. Students identified to take the assessment will receive an invitation on Monday in their Connect classes.

If you have any questions about Capti ReadBasix or how the results will be used, please reach out to their English Language Arts teacher or Principal Clausen.

Students will learn about conceptual art. They will come up with a concept, an idea or a message they would like their art piece to have, then pick a medium, and the materials they will use to create their artwork, before starting to create a work(s) of art for the Art Show at the end of Quarter 2. They will plan, create, revise, critique, and adapt their project throughout the quarter until they have a completed work of art including a title and artist statement about the work to present during the Art Show. Along the way, we will explore different mediums and methods for researching, planning, and creating art.

2025 MCA RESULTS FOR WACONIA MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS

Your child took the state-wide MN Comprehensive Assessments (MCA) last spring (May). Our school received the results, and we have sent them home to you with your child in a sealed envelope today, November 7th. Please check your child's backpack or ask them to share it with you. Some students did not participate in the test, and students who took the test in another school district will receive their results in the mail from their previous school.

After reviewing the testing information, please sit down with your child and discuss his/her performance. Congratulate your child in areas of strength and help to discuss and set goals in growth areas. These are assessments your child will take each spring through his/her school years. The Reading and Math MCA is given to students in Grades 3-8 and Grades 10 & 11. The Science MCA is given to students in Grades 5, 8, and 11.

Spring 2026 Team for Boys & Girls Grade 8-12

Please note that this is a spring sport, and it will not be possible for your participant to participate in both the Clay Target Club and another WHS Spring sport.

This is a Minnesota High School Club/Sport that will challenge you to be the best you can be at the sport of Trap Shooting. This club is affiliated with the Minnesota State High School Clay Target League and will follow their rules and regulations. There is a maximum of 50 students allowed to participate on the team and will first open to current team members. The team will shoot at our home location each week. The scores will then be posted online for virtual competitions against the other schools in our conference. There will be a State Championship on the first weekend in June in Alexandria, MN and a Minnesota State High School League's State Tournament on the 2nd weekend later in June.

The season will consist of several practice rounds at the beginning of the season, 6 competition rounds and a fun round added in to complete the season. Competition and Practice rounds are once a week on Thur from 3:30 to 6:30pm. Each shoot will consist of two (2) rounds of 25 clays. This club will run from mid-March until the second week in June and will conflict with other spring activities! High School Athletic Letters will be awarded to participants achieving a predetermined average.

Parents/Volunteers: This will be a student/parent sport. Involvement by parents is required, this is not a drop off sport due to certain regulations that must be followed. Volunteer coaches and safety monitors are needed to allow this program to take place. Coaches, volunteers and safety monitors are required to pass a background check. There will be 3 mandatory safety meetings that will need to be completed in order to participate.

Items needed to participate are a Firearms Safety Certificate, hearing & sight protection, and any 12ga or 20ga Shotgun. The shooting vest, rounds of clays and shells are provided in the fee structure. Absolutely NO GUNS OR SHELLS will be allowed on District 110 property. Other fees may apply for training sessions, apparel, etc. Clay Target Club is expected to fill fast and go to a waitlist of students.

Make a Plan to Vote on or Before Nov. 4

As many of you likely know, ISD 110 residents face an important decision on Tuesday, Nov. 4 regarding an operating levy that will shape the future of our schools and our community. We have worked diligently to provide clear, accurate information so families and residents can make informed choices. From mailings and social media posts to videos, community presentations, and school-to-home newsletters, our goal has been to ensure you have the resources you need to understand what's at stake.

Early voting continues at the District Office, located at 512 Industrial Boulevard through November 3. Beginning last Friday, the process became even faster, moving from absentee balloting to direct balloting, which generally takes less than five minutes. Parking is available right near the entrance, with spaces specifically reserved for voters and lines of any kind are rare.

Election Day is Tuesday, November 4. All eligible voters are encouraged to participate and make their voices heard. Designated polling places include Waconia Ice Arena, St. Bonifacius City Hall, and New Germany City Hall. You can confirm your polling place at pollfinder.sos.mn.gov.

CANDY CRAZE

If you have an excess of candy in your home, please help prevent students from bringing it to school. If candy is brought to school, please be reminded that students should only be bringing food items for their own consumption.

Al Guidance about what you can do with too much candy...

You can donate candy to organizations like Operation Gratitude and Soldiers' Angels, which send it to troops overseas. Other options include local food banks, homeless shelters, nursing

homes, and dentists who often have buy-back programs. Always call ahead to confirm that the location accepts candy donations.

Organizations:

Operation Gratitude: Sends candy in care packages to military and first responders.

Soldiers' Angels (Treats for Troops): Collects candy for troops and veterans.

Operation Shoebox: Sends candy to deployed troops around the world.

Ronald McDonald House Charities: Many local chapters accept donations to give to families staying at the house.

UNICEF: Offers a program to send candy to children in other countries.

Local donation sites:

Food banks and shelters: Homeless shelters, food pantries, and soup kitchens often welcome candy donations for those in need.

First responder stations: Fire stations and police stations may accept candy, so it's best to call and ask first.

Retirement homes and nursing homes: These facilities often accept candy for residents. Local businesses: Some local businesses, including dentists and orthodontists, have candy buy-back programs where they trade candy for other items.

Before you donate

Call ahead: Always call ahead to your preferred donation site to make sure they accept candy and to confirm their drop-off times.

Check condition: Ensure all candy is unopened and in its original packaging.

OCTOBER WMS SUPPORT TEAM UPDATE

This month, our 6th and 7th-graders took part in a Counselors Connect lesson in the auditorium focused on "Doing Hard Things." We explored how middle school can bring new challenges, like keeping up with homework, studying, staying focused, and staying organized. Developing these skills helps students grow more confident and capable both in and out of the classroom.

Students learned several strategies to help them stay on top of their responsibilities and chose one to practice for the week, including staying organized, making a to-do list, focusing in class, asking for help, planning and prioritizing, and taking care of themselves. We encourage families to help reinforce these habits at home! Middle schoolers are still learning how to be actively engaged in their learning, and your support makes a big difference. Ask your student which strategy they chose to focus on and how it's been going so far.

UPCOMING READING ASSESSMENT

As part of our ongoing commitment to improve our abilities to support every student's reading growth, Waconia Middle School will be using a new reading assessment tool, Capti ReadBasix, for students who are reading below grade level, as indicated by the September FastBridge (FAST) reading assessment. Capti ReadBasix will provide our staff with additional insight into your students' reading strengths and help to identify specific areas of growth. Results will be used to help guide instruction and ensure that all students continue to develop into skilled readers.

The Capti ReadBasix will take about thirty minutes to measure Word Recognition and Decoding, Vocabulary, Morphology, and Reading Efficiency. Students are scheduled to take it during our scheduled academic WILD time on November 20.



First premiering in the 1970s, the show was nominated for six Tony awards, made into a 1999 feature film starring Donny Osmond, and continues to delight audiences around the world today.





Early voting for the Waconia Public Schools 2025 Operating Levy Referendum begins on Friday, September 19. There are several different ways you can complete the voting process between now and November 4, and those options are outlined below.

Vote Early In Person

Early voting will begin on Friday, September 19, 2025, and will continue through Monday, November 3, 2025. Residents of ISD 110 can vote in person at the District Office, located at 512 Industrial Boulevard in Waconia. Voting hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Vote Early By Mail

Step 1: Complete an absentee ballot application by going online to https://mnvotes.sos.mn.gov/abrequest/index

Step 2: Once your application has been completed and submitted, you will be mailed an absentee ballot. Read the instructions that come with your ballot carefully.

Step 3: You will need a witness when you vote and complete your ballot. The witness can be either a U.S. Citizen (at least 18 years old) or a notary.

Step 4: Mail the ballot back in the self-addressed stamped envelope that comes with your ballot. Your ballot will not count if it is received after Election Day (Tuesday, November 4).

Vote In Person on Election Day







Schedules

Schedules are out and lockers have been assigned. There has been considerable excitement among students and staff. We have worked hard to answer questions and adjust schedules. We have communicated the challenge of staffing elective courses with families when students did not get their first or second choice. Elective teachers are typically shared across grade levels, and they have a set number of annual sections as full-time staff.

When a section is full, we do not have another that can be added. It also becomes difficult to fill an elective request when there are other elections for band, choir, accelerated math, special education, math and reading skills, enriched language arts, high-level learners, etc. As much as we want to meet every need and request, there are times we can't. The inability to receive all elections is not uncommon for scheduling at the secondary level. Thank you in advance for understanding the difficulty in making changes to student schedules.

2025-26 Student Schedules:

We are excited to announce that WMS student schedules for the 2025-26 school year are currently available on the Infinite Campus portal. Thank you to our students and families for

your patience as the schedules took a week longer than expected. Once logged into the portal, click on the student in the top right and then navigate to the left column to select "Schedule".

Our middle school schedule is complicated and complex. It is designed to meet a wide variety of needs, options, and experiences we offer at WMS. The effort invested in detailed schedule design creates optimal and individualized learning experiences for all our students. If you notice Read 180, Reading Skills on your child's schedule, they have been scheduled to receive additional reading or math support. If your 6th-, 7th-, or 8th-grade child would benefit from additional reading support, please contact the school administration to discuss available options.

High-Level Learners classes are optional. Sixth-grade students who have been assigned to our High-Level Learners (HLL) PLP class may need to choose which class to miss if they previously elected both the Band and Choir classes. 7th and 8th-grade students who have been assigned to our (HLL) PLP are taking this class as an everyday trimester class. This may affect these students differently depending on their music class elections. This may also mean missing a required encore class, such as every other day Physical Education and every other day Health. Students were assigned to their chosen electives as available.

8th-grade students who did not elect a music class have been scheduled into an every-other-day art course titled *Visual/Media Arts No Music* each trimester. There will be some instances in which they will also have the standard Art 8 class in addition to the alternating classes. A request can be made to elect a different course, although due to tight scheduling, changes will not always be possible. There are a limited number of Team Sports classes available for 7th and 8th graders, and they are currently full.

Schedule changes that will be possible include:

- Adding Band or Choir in 6, 7, and 8
- Adding 7th and 8th Grade Enriched Language Arts
- Adding 8th-grade Art in place of a current elective Encore class
- Adding Reading Skills
- Declining an Accelerated Math Placement
- Adding classes that are missing or adjusting classes that are doubled up
- Special Education needs
- Team/teacher alignment for families of twins or triplets
- Summer parent requests that did not get fulfilled

Changes that are not possible:

- Moving classes to be with known friends and classmates
- Changes to elective course assignments, except to add Art in 8th grade
- Additions to 7th or 8th Grade Team Sports classes
- Specific teacher requests not previously submitted
- Additions to Accelerated or Double Accelerated Math
- Changing a Music election

- Academic Lock- \$7.00: 6th-grade students will have their own lock to put on their

STUDENT INSURANCE

ISD #110 Waconia Public Schools does not provide any type of health or accident insurance for injuries incurred by your child at school or at school events. Since children are particularly susceptible to injuries, the district encourages you to review your present health and accident insurance program to determine if your coverage is adequate.

If you do not feel your insurance is adequate, because of a deductible, a coinsurance clause, or if you do not have insurance, the district encourages you to review the Student Insurance Program available to district families through a private provider.

THE STUDENT INSURANCE PROGRAM: The student insurance program provides benefits for medical expenses incurred because of an accident at school, and the program's major expense benefit is designed primarily for families with no other insurance or with high deductible plans.
