Gentleness

1 Thessalonians 2: 1-12

Purpose: To learn how to be "gentle" Christians as we go through our journey of discipleship.

Group Discussion: Think of the most gentle person you know? Describe that person.

Personal Reflection: We all have different personalities. How does your personality affect how you express gentleness?

- 1. (Verses 3-6) What are the wrong ways described in these verses as to how we should not share Christ?
- 2. Let's say you want a non-Christian to accept Christ as his savior, provide an example of how you would use tricks or flattery.
- 3. What verses outline Paul's motives for sharing the gospel. Briefly provide these motives.
- 4. (Verses 7-9) In a spiritual sense, Paul was like a "mother" to the Thessalonians. How so?
- 5. As Christians, we are to bring others to Christ through the sharing of the gospel. (a) Why are Christians hesitant to perform this command (Matthew 28:19-20)? (b) Could the hesitation be due to time? energy? embarrassment? vulnerability?
- 6. (Verses 10-12) In a spiritual sense, Paul was like a "father" to the Thessalonians. How so?
- 7. From your study of this lesson, how are evangelism and gentleness related?
- 8. What simple and practical ways can we encourage others to diligently work at having lives which pleases God?
- 9. Think of one person who you know (or knew) requires/required your energy and time to get (or keep) him/her on a path to show gentleness. How did you go about helping this person?
- 10. If you have ever doubted the faithfulness of God, what have you learned from this lesson to remove all doubt?
