Honoring the picket line could mean:

- Joining the picket line on your campus;
- Canceling or refusing to attend a synchronous class;
- Refusing to watch asynchronous lectures;
- Refusing to pre-record a class or prepare other materials for later asynchronous use;
- Refusing to engage in other forms of university-based labor, including email response;
- Protecting any students, colleagues, and workers from retaliation;
- Attending a regional walkout action.

Faculty to students:

Dear Students,

I am cancelling class on Monday, May 3; refusing to provide asynchronous class material for Monday, May 3; and refusing to record materials on Monday, May 3, to be available later in the week, in observance of the walkout to abolish campus police. I support getting cops off our campus to make our university truly safe and free for all, and I will not cross the picket line.

As someone who takes your learning seriously, I do not choose this action lightly. I believe that asking students to consider what it means to act in solidarity with this movement represents an important learning opportunity, one in which we confront together the recognition that the most changes have always required discomfort and sacrifice. I will sign the May 3 Pledge.

Students to faculty:

Dear [Name],

We, the students of [], collectively absent ourselves from class on May 3 and/or will not attend any asynchronous lecture or perform any other academic work in observance of the walkout to abolish campus police. We support getting cops off our campus and will not cross the picket line and will sign the May 3 Pledge.

Students to supervisors:

Dear [Name],

We, the student-workers of [], collectively absent ourselves from work on May 3 in observance of the walkout to abolish campus police. We <u>will sign the May 3 Pledge</u>. We support getting <u>cops off our campus</u> and will not cross the picket line.

Our campus is participating in a nationwide work stoppage on May 3 as part of a national movement to abolish campus police. This includes any work for the university/attending class as a kickoff for #AbolitionMay actions. Administrators refuse to listen to our demands, so we are ready to make a statement that we want cops off our campus and out of our communities. This walkout is a chance to act in solidarity with the movement for abolition on all campuses. Don't cross the picket line and find language to talk to your professors here.

Faculty to faculty:

Dear [colleague],

In solidarity with the movement to abolish campus police and the call for a nationwide day of refusal on May 3, I am requesting that you sign the May 3 Pledge; refuse to do any work for the university (e.g. cancel class; refuse to provide asynchronous class material; refuse to record materials on Monday, May 3 to be available later in the week, or engage in any other form of academic labor, such as answering emails) in observance of the walkout. As someone who takes teaching and learning seriously, I do not make this request lightly, but I believe the May 3 work stoppage represents an important learning opportunity for ourselves and our students as to what it means to act in solidarity with the movement for abolition on all educational campuses. I urge you to show your support by refusing to cross the picket line.

5/3 non-retaliation letter:

Students: Feel free to forward this to your department's chair or graduate/undergraduate director (if faculty position), or a sympathetic professor, and ask them to adopt this statement! Faculty can show support on a class by class basis (syllabus language can be found below), but truly effective solidarity must be structural and must happen at the departmental level!

Dear [Department] students,

As the [Chair/graduate or undergraduate director], I write in support of the Cops Off Campus Coalition's day of refusal on May 3, 2021. In solidarity with those mobilizing for abolition on all educational campuses, I support faculty, staff, and student decisions to join the nationwide call for a one-day work stoppage on May 3rd to end campus

policing. I recognize that many of our Black, Brown, and Indigenous students have not only faced a global health pandemic, ongoing ecological crises, and more in the past year, but also the continued threat of racialized police violence. We must acknowledge that policing disproportionately violates Black, Brown, Indigenous, queer, trans, and poor peoples and immigrants and ultimately renders all members of campus and its surrounding communities unsafe. I am committed to a campus that advances racial justice by ending such forms of harm, and I support students working towards this vision.

The Department of **[NAME]** will not retaliate against undergraduate or graduate students who join the abolition events happening nationwide on May 3 or beyond for exercising their first amendment rights. Further, **I/we/the department** oppose(s) any threat of retaliation that may come from the administration, and stand beside our students in the struggle for racial justice and a more livable university environment for all.

I am disappointed that the university has not yet taken substantive action to provide alternatives to policing in the face of incontrovertible evidence regarding the racialized harm it perpetuates. I call on the **[CAMPUS]** administration to substantively respond to the calls for divestment from police and policing on our campus.

Proposed syllabus language:

I acknowledge that policing disproportionately violates Black, Brown, Indigenous, queer, trans, and poor peoples and ultimately renders all members of campus and its surrounding communities unsafe. I am committed to a campus that advances racial justice by ending such forms of harm, and I support students, staff, and faculty working towards this vision. Students participating in the nationwide actions on 5/3 will not be penalized in this class.

Proposed out of office reply:

In solidarity with the movement to abolish campus police and the call for a <u>nationwide day of refusal on May 3</u>, I am out of the office. I have <u>signed the May 3 pledge</u> in support of getting cops off our campus and I will not cross the picket line.
