Math Placement Test - Only if your SAT MAT was less than 550 or your ACT MAT was less than 22. Take
this online placement test as soon as possible and prior to registering for classes. If you don't pass the
Math Placement Test with a score of 10 or higher, then register for MAT 1001 (Foundations in
Mathematics and Mindsets)

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

- 1. R C 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
- 2. Enroll in **MAT 1035** (see Math Placement note above)
- 3. Enroll in a General Education (aka Gen Ed) course*
- 4. Enroll in a General Education (aka Gen Ed) course*
- 5. Enroll in **CIS 1060**
- 6. Choose a Wellness Literary course

- Rewatch the <u>Gen Ed video in PREP</u> to better understand the Categories and Designations components of Gen Ed.
 - All English Literary Studies: ENG xxxx (LS) designation courses have a prerequisite of R C 1000, First Year Writing (R C = Rhetoric & Composition.)
- BOONE CAMPUS students: Here is a <u>color-coded 2-page General Education checksheet</u> (updated 3x/day) that shows which Boone Campus Gen Ed classes have open seats.

Alternative Courses for Your First Semester:

Can't get into the classes above? Try these:

- Choose a General Education **Science Inquiry (SI). Enroll in one SI course.
- 1-2 credit hours of Wellness Literacy
- Enroll in an additional Gen Ed Course

^{**}Note that some science courses need to be taken sequentially (in a specific order). Chemistry Connections, The Physics of our Technological World, and Physics with Calculus are not encouraged for this major because they are required for other majors and also require specific math prerequisites.

*Please plan for your Fine Arts (FA), Historical Studies (HS), Literary Studies (LS) and Social Science (SS) designations appropriately. If you want to, you can plan for your Foundations of American Democracy (FAD) degree requirement (indicated by a symbol on the 2025-2026 General Education Program of Study) to count toward three requirements: i.e. FAD, SS, and HUM.
