Highlighted = Seeds I already has/need to be germinated

Highlighted = I have the seeds, planting it is the question (low priority)

Highlighted = Probably don't need, keep on list as a backup

Highlighted = Still need to get Highlighted = planted 1/15/24

Trees (woody, >6ft):

Eastern Redbud (cercis canadensis)

Large, plant in shade under white oak

Flowering dogwood (benthamidia florida)

Large, plant towards front of garden if there is room

I have a random dogwood seedling, MIGHT be flowering sp.? Might be something else entirely, I say plant it and see what happens; worst case is we remove it and put a flowering dogwood in its place

Sweetshrub (calycanthus floridus)

Decent sized shrub, cool red flowers for some variety and pretty easy to grow

Could replace one or both of the dogwoods

Needs to be germinated and grown as a seedling before planting

Wafer Ash (ptelea trifoliata)

Likes warm, wet, shitty soil

Needs to be germinated and grown as a seedling before planting

Shrubs (woody, <6ft):

Beautyberry (callicarpa americana)

Edible, edge of garden

Buy as a seedling if possible

Blackhaw (viburnum nudum)

Edge of garden probably

Tall wildflowers (>2 ft):

New York Ironweed (vernonia novaboracensis)

Likes full sun and moist soil (water frequently)

Sow densely; low germination success)

Common Milkweed (Asclepias syriaca)

Can tolerate full sun to shade

Sow seeds in late fall/winter and LIGHTLY cover in dirt

Joe pyeweed (eutrochium sp.)

Likes part sun

Rattlesnake master (eryngium yuccifolium)

Full sun or partial shade

Aaron's Rod (thermopsis villosa)

Full sun/part shade, native to mtns idk how it'll grow in piedmont

Bearded beggarticks (bidens aristosa)

Part shade

I have 0 experience with this plant but it looks cool

Foxglove Beardtongue (penstemon digitalis)(also have P. smallii)

Sow outside in fall/winter, don't cover seeds

Full sun

I've never worked with this one before

Frost Aster (symphyotrichum pilosum)

Mild sun/light shade (don't burn it)

Medium wildflowers (1-2 ft):

Orange(?) Coneflower (rudbeckia fulgida)(also have Purple Coneflower E. purpurea)

Can tolerate any amount of light but likes a good amount of sun

Sow outdoors in late winter, needs well-drained soil

Goldenrod (solidago sp.(caesia maybe))

Good for native flies (not annoying ones)(might get taller than 3ft depending on sp.)

Ragwort (packera sp.)

Honeybee haven, part sun

Dwarf Iris (iris verna)

Part sun-shade, good for moths

Star Tickseed (coreopsis pubescens)

Plant on outer edge of garden and prepare to have way too much of it

American Ginseng (panax quinquefolius)

Shade

Jack-in-the-pulpit (arisaema triphyllum)

Shade/part sun

Hoary Mountain Mint (Imao)(pycnanthemum incanum)

Native to mountains but smells realy good in the spring and summer

Start indoors in late winter, transplant outside in ~4 months

Full sun/part shade

Eastern Bluestar (Amsonia tabernaemonatana)

Sow outdoors in fall or cold-stratify for 2-3 days, slow to germinate

Likes moist sun and partial shade

Short wildflowers (<1 ft):

Red columbine (aquilegia canadensis)

Really good for hummingbirds, make sure its not too close to anything else Shade

Trumpet creeper (campsis radicans)

VINE with beautiful orange flowers, needs a tree to grow on

Sun/part shade (would be good on the oak tree)
