

Interrogative Pronouns

Interrogative pronouns are words that begin questions. Words such as *who*, *what*, and *which* are interrogative pronouns.

interrogative pronoun

Who will ask the mayor if we can build a community park?

Possessive Pronouns

A **possessive pronoun** shows ownership. Some possessive pronouns appear before a noun. Other possessive pronouns stand alone. A possessive pronoun can be used to avoid repeating a noun in a sentence.

Stand alone

possessive pronoun

Our town has a park with a community garden.

Avoid repeating nouns

noun *possessive pronoun*

Kids help **their** community by working in the garden.

Indefinite Pronouns

An **indefinite pronoun** refers to a person or thing that is not identified. Words such as *someone*, *something*, *anyone*, *everything*, *either*, *each*, and *neither* are indefinite pronouns.

indefinite pronoun

Someone volunteered to take over our community garden.
