Whether we like it or not, the idea of being "liberal" has twisted to the sense of perversion within the United States. To be liberal is to adopt the position that there ought to be a continuum of freedom, something in which the United States has enjoyed since our founding in 1776. There are two main schools of thought within this ideology which underpin American society — laissez faire and welfare liberalism. The former is one which advocates that the individual is sovereign, and enjoys a certain form of "rights-based liberalism" where government is seen as the defender of rights. The latter is one which advocates for equality, where government ought to be involved in order to make life more equal to protect the disadvantaged. A story which best captures this is that of the one armed swimmer, one that is often told in the Jurisprudence lectures at Harvard Law School.

There is a high school swimming competition in Michigan open to all individuals, to win the competition, all swimmers ought to place both of their hands at the edge of the swimming pool. In this situation, how can the one armed swimmer even stand a chance? Welfare liberals distinguish between formal and substantive equality, the former where everyone has certain rights, whereas in the latter it is one whereby the individual is offered the substance to achieve that right. Within the context of the one armed swimmer, welfare liberals will say that substantial equality ought to apply, and needs to be offered to the one armed swimmer — that she should be permitted to put her one and only hand onto the edge in order to win the race or compete in an equal fashion.

With legislative agendas from the Democratic Party which advocate for medicare for all, an uncapped payroll tax, and student debt forgiveness, it is safe to say that they reside within the welfare camp. Under this principle, people ought to be given

There have been no concerns voiced over the President's policies, nor have there been any regarding the background of the nominees. They are simply refraining from even conducting a hearing, and then, voting with the party line with an overwhelming "no". If we apply the story of the one armed swimmer to that of the current political situation, it is evident that the present-day Democrats have forgotten the roots in which their movement and this country have been founded

upon. They have not even given the substantial equality to these nominees, and yet, demand for the immunity against veto for the legislative agendas for them.

Senate Majority Leader Barnes has said "Come on, it's [sim's] boring and dead right now. Let's spice it up a little. Make a deal, pass something, I don't know. I mean fuckin hell aren't you guys bored? Don't you wanna actually do something with the presidency?" Vice President Steven stood up to the playground bully and said, "Then don't be as obstructive as Trump", to which SML Barnes shrugged, and then replied, "I gave Adith terms [medicare for all, student loan forgiveness, uncapped payroll tax, price controls] and he seemed amicable about it. The abuse of the system by SML Barnes evidences the Democratic party's inconsideration towards welfare, and only demands legislative promises for the betterment of his own personal position within the United States. For if he loses his next election, what else will there be for him to return to? He has nothing aside for his position here. It is the motives of a power-hungry individual who leads the Democratic party, blind to the values in which they have long advocated for under Presidents Obama and Kennedy.

As we inch slowly day by day to the next Senate election the Democrats would be good to remember their conduct against the Adith government.
