Interview Q&A

1. What is your greatest strength?

I think I would say that my greatest strength is being thorough; I have fine attention to detail. I care about hard work because I learned how to do it correctly and independently as a homeschooled student, all the way from K–12, and as an older sister to four brothers. I maintained getting mostly A's through college.

Really, I'm just the kind of person who will not leave a project until I feel that it's done to the best ability that it can be. I can definitely meet deadlines, because I am also the kind of student who almost never turned in any of her assignments late. But I want to make sure that those assignments contain the highest quality of work that they can. If it's what it takes, I will plan out my priorities ahead of time so that I can make sure each project gets the proper amount of attention that it deserves.

2. How do you balance life and work?

Honestly, it can be a struggle sometimes. However, as I said concerning being thorough, I break it down to time management. If I tell myself that this one section of time is what I have been allotted to get my workload done for the day, then I will do my best to stick to that, and then I will feel properly achieved when I can stop for the day and relax and enjoy my personal life. If I can give my perfectionistic tendencies a boundary and ground rules to base themselves around, then I can be okay enjoying the rest of my life when I'm away from all that.

3. What would you do if you won the lottery?

If I won the lottery, I would put it toward all the important things first: I would like security in life for helping my current family and for building my future one—I could work on getting a car (after I learn how to drive) and my own apartment (and eventually a house), and I could springboard my hope of adopting one of my kids. I would also like to still be able to do my creative writing and other hobbies without worry. And my mom and I have also had dreams of going to Iceland and England someday.

Smaller things could come up along the way, like opportunities to help people in need and occasionally going to see even more places in the world. I might even want to save up for a telescope sometime since I took (and really enjoyed) an Introduction to Astronomy class. Generally speaking, however, depending on how much money I had won, I could have a good basis for building my life. And then I would hopefully worry less, and I would be of use in the world more.
