'I love Aldates. It's a large, warm, passionate church where there's so many opportunities to live out faith in the week, be it helping refugees learn english or serving on kids group. The teaching is fantastic, both challenging and gratifying and there's been worship on the sight for over a 1000 years. We have ~250 students in the student community with a 50/50 split with Brookes (so good to leave that uni-of bubble!), where I've found friends for life and had the joy of seeing many more mates who wouldn't have called themselves Christian come to faith. It's a total gift.'

'I chose to go to Aldates because I wanted to get stuck into a church with lots of support for student life in Oxford. I love the student nights, and have found church to be such a welcoming and grounding place during the busyness of Oxford terms.'

'Ebbe's is a church that is both rooted in the Bible and has a very close-knit community of students; I have grown so much in my knowledge of God and his Word this year while also making lovely friends that I can walk my journey of faith with. Ebbe's is a church that is big but feels quite small once you start meeting people - it really helps that we have a truly great student team whose friendliness and support were a big factor in why I settled here!'

'Trinity Church is a close-knit church family that felt like home when I first attended their services. I was welcomed and able to get stuck into the life of the church very quickly! Trinity holds various events and seminars across term. After evening services we often play board games and catch up together. We also have homegroups, where we meet in houses and enjoy dinner before getting stuck into the Bible each week. It has been a great way to step out of the student bubble and enjoy fellowship with Christians in different stages of their lives. I love the way that Trinity prioritises God's Word and seeks to be like Jesus in all aspects of its services and community. 'I like Trinity church because the preaching and worship is deeply grounded in the Word.
