I. Executive Summary

Defend Florida is launching a bold, proactive operations initiative in response to the unprecedented obstruction of citizen-backed legislation and the increasing alignment of state leadership with special interests and corrupt power structures. This campaign is grounded in the principles of Agenda 26 and the Trumpet Leadership Campaign, aiming to restore transparency, citizen governance, and moral leadership in the state of Florida.

This plan activates a multi-county grassroots and leadership strategy starting in Charlotte, Sarasota, and Manatee counties, expanding to the rest of the state through proven momentum and key partnerships.

II. Strategic Landscape & Problem Statement

Challenges Identified:

- Governor calling out the Legislature's failures—an unusual but strategic opportunity.
- Five citizen-backed bills sponsored but halted by Speaker Danny Perez, President Albritton, and others.
- Obstruction of immigration enforcement and election integrity bills.
- SB 1118 threatens county authority, sponsored by developer interests.
- SB 1760 (Grall) and HB 1445 (Mayfield) will likely remove America First, Health Freedom First Surgeon General Joe Ladapo from office [\[1\]](#)
- SB1249 attempts to place the chair of the GOP in sole command of who runs as a Republican candidate for any office, anywhere in the state of Florida, essentially neutralizing any pathways for reform in the state.
- Rising volunteer frustration due to systemic suppression.
- Continued actions by Secretary of State to counter transparency in elections process (the latest move is his support to mitigate PRR (through 1381)

- GOP leadership (the chair of the Florida Republican party) compromised by financial entanglements (being an employee of powerful anti America first lobbyist - David Ramba) with lobbyists controlling Supervisors of Elections (FSE is now under the command and control of David Ramba)

Opportunity: The dysfunction among establishment powers has created a fracture point—one that can be leveraged by coordinated, proactive grassroots mobilization to create transparency, accountability and better governance

X. Broader Mission Integration

This operation will also advance Agenda 26's broader objectives:

- Expose and combat human trafficking
- Break the monopoly of corporations on food, medicine, and media

- Reform Election processes
- Combat grip of big food and big pharma on health freedom

What's Broken in Our States:

Learning from Legacy: What Mar-a-Lago Teaches the Florida Restoration Initiative

I. Mar-a-Lago: A Strategic Legacy of Place, Power, and Purpose

Visionary Beginnings

Mar-a-Lago began as a bold, unconventional vision by Marjorie Merriweather Post in the 1920s. She ignored critics who dismissed the swampy land as unusable, and instead built a 128-room estate that would stand as a monument to elegance and influence. Completed in 1927, it spanned from the Atlantic Ocean to Lake Worth—symbolically and literally connecting two worlds.

We take note: The Florida Restoration Initiative is also being built on ground many consider hostile—politically and culturally. But just like Mar-a-Lago's foundation was laid on overlooked land, we see strategic opportunity where others see frustration and futility. Our foundation is vision plus action.

A Power Center in Physical Form

Post didn't just build a home; she constructed a hub—a geographic focal point that would attract dignitaries, royalty, business moguls, and eventually political leaders. She even envisioned it as a Winter White House, offering it to the federal government for official use. Though returned due to maintenance costs, the estate's intent as a national center of leadership never faded.

Trump later fulfilled that vision, purchasing the estate in 1985 after it languished for years. By transforming it into a private club, he not only restored it but turned it into a revenue-generating power center—hosting global leaders, shaping narratives, and funding movements.

We are positioned likewise. Venice, Florida—just three hours from Mar-a-Lago—is close enough to tap into the gravitational pull of one of the most significant conservative centers in America. We don't need to build a palace, but we *must build a place*. A hub. A physical epicenter that anchors Defend Florida and the Florida Restoration Initiative. This hub can do more than host meetings—it can aggregate influence, activate networks, and foster loyalty.

II. Parallels to the Florida Restoration Initiative

1. Vision in the Face of Resistance

Just as Mar-a-Lago was criticized for being impractical, we face a cultural and political landscape in Florida where principled action is often met with obstruction. Like Post and Trump, we are operating against the grain. That is the source of our strength—not our weakness.

2. The Power of a Physical Base

Mar-a-Lago's transformation teaches us this: *location is leverage*. Geography matters. Proximity matters. A base of operations builds identity, consistency, and loyalty. The Florida Restoration Initiative will benefit from anchoring operations in a physical space—perhaps a facility in Venice or Sarasota that can serve as the official Restoration Center—a place for:

- Leadership training
- Donor summits
- Prayer and strategy gatherings
- Media production
- Volunteer coordination

By inviting select leaders and supporters into this space regularly, we recreate the dynamic Trump engineered with his membership-based model—only with purpose, not exclusivity.

III. Creating Value & Revenue Like Mar-a-Lago

Trump didn't just open the gates to Mar-a-Lago—he offered access, status, and alignment with a winning vision. That's what justified high membership fees. People paid for proximity to power and access to a shared mission.

We can do the same—with authenticity. Here are a few ways the Florida Restoration Initiative can generate revenue while building a movement:

1. **Membership-Based Patriot Leadership Alliance**
Offer vetted individuals access to regular strategy briefings, exclusive training content, and behind-the-scenes access to campaign operations. This isn't pay-to-play—it's pay-to-partner.
 2. **Restoration Summits & Political Bootcamps**
Charge for immersive weekend experiences where leaders and aspiring officials are trained, networked, and empowered—hosted at the Restoration Center or key partner venues.
 3. **Founders Circle & Legacy Builder Campaigns**
Offer high-level donors recognition, strategic roles, and invitation-only events. Position giving as investment in Florida's future, not just charity.
 4. **Media Sponsorship Opportunities**
Turn your town halls, livestreams, and conferences into sponsored platforms for aligned businesses, medical freedom groups, veteran organizations, etc.
 5. **Premium Publishing & Research**
Create members-only white papers, political briefings, and training manuals tied to Agenda 26 and Trumpet Leadership to educate and activate citizens.

IV. History as Hindsight—And Launchpad

Mar-a-Lago teaches us that a bold vision—when rooted in real purpose and embodied in a strategic location—can alter the trajectory of a state and even a nation.

- Post tried to create a place of peace and diplomacy.
- Trump repurposed it as a war room for political revival.
- We must now learn from both: combine sanctuary and strategy, virtue and boldness, principle and practicality.

We are not only fighting corruption—we are building legacy. And just like Mar-a-Lago has outlived its critics, so will the Florida Restoration Initiative.
