About: Tune in to Story Time with Julia Zemiro and Kiya as they discover the wonder and mystery of the Australian rainforest in the classic picture book, Where The Forest Meets The Sea by Jeannie Baker.

Early childhood teacher notes

This activity aligns well to the Early Years Learning Framework and is easily adapted to suit the learner's existing knowledge. In the 'before viewing' activity, adult verbal prompting can be used to support the rainforest concept, and further with the following imagine task. It may be suitable to do the first and last activity only, but if learners require extension all activities could be explored.
