Item #2 Approval of December 2 Meeting Minutes, Amanda Murray

Jennie motioned to approve, Nick seconded. Amanda Kari and Larisa said aye

Item #3 Principal's Report, Mrs. Johnson

Had a good jamboree - a lot of TK turnout and questions, at least 40 families were there. This year Greenhills passed out a pamphlet going over the differences and similarities between traditional grades and MA. Many families went over to the MA classrooms to tour and meet teachers. Tomorrow is the 100th day of school celebration, all grade levels are invited to dress up and participate or wear green. We're starting a math lab - math intervention for those who need a little extra math help after school, for 1st, 2nd, 3rd grades for kids who need help - more game based and hands-on. Playground replacement equipment is here and should be put in on Friday. All students will do iReady tests again in Feb. K-2 will do it at the end of the year while 3rd does CAASP. Parents should get updates of results with spring progress reports.

Item #4 Grade Level Updates, PTC Teacher Representatives

- TK, Gomez:
 - TK has been working on the letters M and O, are on P this week. Pajama day on Friday. 100 day activities are happening, 10's and counting up to 100. Arctic animals are a focus - penguins, arctic foxes, polar bears. In math, we are focused on 1-10. Next will be shapes, transportation and Valentine's Day. There was a question on when TK playground will be complete - Mrs. Gomez updated the group that not everything is ordered, probably will not be complete until next school year. TK teachers are thinking about asking DAD's club to paint a track on the blacktop. Mrs. Gomez mentioned we might not be able to put all 3 classes in the TK area at the same time.
- K, Lobban:
 - Kindergarten is starting to get in the flow of things! Something magical happens to the brains of Kindergarteners this month, when they are more ready to start putting all their foundational learning into mastery and beyond. Students are blending words together as well as reading in "decodable texts." In science we are learning all about plants, and putting that knowledge into writing our first informational writing, aka "teaching books," which is our next unit in writing. In math, we are learning about numbers up to 100, and culminating with a celebration of the 100th day on the 28th! Finally, the students have been able to

use the tricycles for a few weeks, and are loving it - thank you again for funding our grant proposal!

- 1, Shafto:
 - 1. Pajama Day, January 26 - Students came dressed in their pajamas and brought their favorite book and stuffie. Students were engaged in reading, being read to, reading to a friend, sharing, making a book, drinking hot chocolate & marshmallows, and FUN! FUN! FUN!
 - 2. 100's Day, January 28 - First Graders are so excited to reach the 100th day of school this Wednesday. Reaching three digit numbers will help in their understanding of Place Value. They will also be invited to dress up like they are 100 years old, or decorate a shirt and wear it to school, or wear green for Greenhills Spirit.
 - 3. Math - speaking of Place Value, we are beginning to dive in deep to understand the meaning of Tens & Ones and working with higher numbers beyond 20.
 - 4. Arctic Animals - Polar Bears and other arctic animals have been the focus this month.
- 2, Brown:
 - We are rolling right along in second grade. We just wrapped up all the vowel teams and diphthongs (ou, ow, oi, oy) in phonics. We are now working on silent letter combinations and then will move into some suffixes for words. In reading we are working on using text evidence to Compare and Contrast characters in a story. We will be to cause and effect with informational text soon. In writing we just finished a timeline of MLK Jr. and are now working on the Informational Writing unit for Mystery Writing. In math, we just wrapped up money and time along with 2-step word problems and balancing equations. We just started our unit on numbers to 1,000. We will use this knowledge to move into adding and subtracting 3 digit numbers. Finally, in Science we just began our Works of Water unit where we focus on where river begin and what erosion is. We wanted to thank the PTC for the yummy lunch last week and all the wonderful things you do for the school.
- 3, Bousfield:
 - Field Trip to Roseville Theater - Dear Edwina. Off Broadway Prep right now. March 27 - lots of practice. Teacher for the day on Friday. 100th Day, maybe 3rd graders dressing up. Deep into division. Fractions will start in Feb. ELA - using evidence from text. Will begin bringing home an extra piece of homework. Planets and invisible forces. Mindfulness. CAASP Practice Tests - very first time for a lot of them. Jennie will reach out to Loomis Author.

Ms. Heiskell, Ms. Gooler, and I were on campus meeting families and sharing information about what the Multiage program looks like alongside TK and Traditional K teachers, who were also here highlighting their programs. It was a great opportunity to connect with incoming families.
