Nebraska

- Desire to plant student fellowships at University of Nebraska, Lincoln

St. Louis

- Extensive faculty ministry needing Campus Staff Minister
- Existing faculty fellowships at Washington University, Washington Univ Medical Campus, Lindenwood University, St. Louis Community College - Forest Park
- Desire to develop Faculty and Graduate Student fellowships at St. Louis University

Missouri

- Campus Staff Minister for Columbia
- Develop existing Faculty Chapter at Mizzou
- Plant Graduate Student Fellowship at Mizzou alongside existing International Student ministry

Iowa and Kansas

- Additional staff leadership desired to develop work currently happening
- Potential for greater faculty ministry at University of Iowa in Iowa City.
- Room for planting more student and faculty ministry at University of Kansas, Lawrence

Places staff candidates typically originate from:

- Undergraduate InterVarsity! Staff who've been on campus few years who would benefit from a change of pace or target audience.
- Seminaries. People with graduate level theological training who aren't drawn to church ministry.
- Churches. Some pastors and ministry leaders who value the university and connect well with academic people.
- Ministry leaders who have worked with international students are often drawn to graduate students more broadly (a large fraction of International students are also graduate students).
- It is really helpful for the candidate to have been a graduate student and earned a master's degree.
- Academic Departments! Some professors considering retirement yet have gifts and passion for doing ministry wind up in volunteer or part time roles (one of our team's most effective faculty staff members is a professor emeritus at Iowa State University).
