The text of the abstract must have a maximum of 1.800 characters, including spaces.

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Acknowledgements: e.g. funding (if needed)

References (max. 5 citations):

- **All references cited in the text are to be listed at the end of the paper.**
- The list of references should be arranged alphabetically by authors' names, and chronologically per author. For co-authored works, the following order should be used: Publications of the single author, arranged according to publication year - publications of the same author with one co-author, arranged according to publication year - publications of the author with more than one co-author, arranged according to publication year.
