## Greenfield Public Schools Federal Street Elementary School School Improvement Plan 2018-2021

## **Federal Street Elementary School Instructional Focus:**

A coordinated school-wide effort to have all Federal Street School students demonstrate growth in their ability to read, comprehend, and respond effectively in a variety of ways to informational materials in all academic areas.

## Introduction

Federal Street Elementary School is the school with the downtown connection. The curriculum has a specialization in partnering with local businesses. At each grade level, students will be learning and partnering with a variety of businesses downtown. The students will also perform community services with people of the downtown to include: the fire station, post office, town offices; including the Mayor, the hospital, and the YMCA in addition to new partnerships each year.

Federal Street is a K-4 elementary school that houses 14 classrooms with an average class size of twenty. Federal Street embraces a 3 tiered literacy model to address the needs of all students. All students are provided with online accounts for programs to practice and master math and reading skills. Academic progress monitoring is emphasized to optimize student achievement; every child's progress is reviewed at regular grade level meetings to ensure acceleration in both math and reading. Expectations for student achievement are high and include excellent attendance, effort, achievement and citizenship. Federal St. School is a school-wide Title 1 school and this School Improvement Plan serves as the school's Title 1 plan. All Federal St. School teachers and paraprofessionals are highly qualified.

Federal Street practices Responsive Classroom, an approach to elementary teaching that emphasizes social, emotional, and academic growth in a strong and safe school community. The Responsive Classroom approach is based on the premise that children learn best when they have both academic and social-emotional skills. Parental involvement is exceptional and there is an active PTO that generously supports the school programs. This School Improvement Plan serves as the school's Title I school-wide plan.
