Dear OHS Seniors,

While spring will be filled with opportunities for you to celebrate your time at OHS, it can also bring a sense of anxiety and stress as you increase your independence and take on more responsibilities. As part of our goal of ensuring each of you are ready for life after high school, our student services team, our business education department, along with several businesses and partners from across the Waukesha County area, have designed a financial simulation experience known as Reality Check for all of our seniors to participate in on Tuesday, April 12, 2022.

Reality Check tries to mirror real-life scenarios to help you understand the financial realities you may face. During the simulation, each of you will choose an occupation with a salary. You will need to manage and make decisions on important life events such as buying a house, budgeting for food, paying for insurance, buying a vehicle, and paying off any debts, such as student loans.

Seniors should report to the Cafeteria at Main Campus at their designated time (shown below) on Tuesday, April 12. This is a scheduled release day for juniors to participate in Career, College, and Life Readiness activities. Freshmen and sophomores will report to OHS to complete the ACT Aspire.
