The following is a course and class procedure outline for the semester. This course is a one Semester long course, with a U.S. Constitution Test and a Common Final Assessment. Please, read through this outline to ensure your success in this class.

1. Attendance

In this class, students are expected to take responsibility for their own learning. One important part of taking responsibility is to be present on a daily basis and participate in a positive manner. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to ask for the necessary information that you may have missed. You must also make-up all assignments, quizzes, or tests within the same number of days as you were absent. Tardies will result in referrals and possible detentions. In accordance with school policy, frequent absences will result in being dropped from the class.

2. Classroom Behavior

As students at Niles West, you will be expected to display mutual respect at all times. Please, follow the guidelines below to have success.

- ♠ Always be prepared, with classroom materials.
- ♠ Be in your seat before the bell rings and ready to work.
- ♠ Do not get up from your seat without permission or, until you are dismissed.

Late assignments will be given less credit or no credit at all.

5. Projects and Writing Assignments

Students will be working on many different types of projects during the school year. Projects are due on time and need to be complete for credit. Writing assignments will be given in order to prepare students for future higher-level assessments.

6. Tests/Quizzes

Chapter and Unit tests and quizzes will be announced in advance. Occasionally, quizzes will be given to reinforce daily study. Many various assessments will be used to challenge each student. All missing assessments will need to be made up in the Testing Center #1145. Failure to make up an assessment will result in a zero for that test or quiz.

7. Grading Scale
